this handbook presents an international collection of essays examining history education past and present framing recent curriculum reforms in canada and in the united states in light of a century long debate between the relationship between theory and practice this collection contextualizes the debate by exploring the evolution of history and social studies education within their state or national contexts with contributions ranging from canada finland new zealand sweden the netherlands the republic of south africa the united kingdom and the united states chapters illuminate the ways in which curriculum theorists and academic researchers are working with curriculum developers and educators to translate and refine notions of historical thinking or inquiry as well as pedagogical practice

this volume consists of the proceedings of an international conference on cognition and instruction in history the papers cover several areas historical narratives and history teaching the use of texts documents and images in learning history and historical explanation and understanding

a resource book for teachers of world history at all levels the text contains individual sections on art gender religion philosophy literature trade and technology lesson plans reading and multi media recommendations and suggestions for classroom activities are also provided

the book reflects that social studies teaching should be recursive and fluid allowing for movement forward backward inward and outward thus creating opportunities for students to examine events not just through the rote memorization of dominant facts and figures but through critical inquiry and reflection

this book examines the nexus between nation building and history education globally and the implication for cultural diversity and social justice it studies some of the major education reforms and policy issues in history education in a global culture and regards them in the light of recent shifts in history education and policy research in doing so the volume provides a comprehensive picture of the intersecting and diverse discourses of globalisation history education and policy driven reforms it makes clear that the impact of globalisation on education policy and reforms is a strategically significant issue for us all the book focuses on the importance of nation building and patriotism in history education and presents up to date research on global trends in history education reforms and policy research it provides an easily accessible practical yet scholarly source of information about the international concerns in the field of globalisation history education and policy research

originally published in 1972 this book is a systematic analysis of the objectives and methods of history teaching the book considers the criticisms of the 1960s and 70s of history as a subject and the pressures for its replacement in the school curriculum it examines the complex psychological background of learning history and suggests that historical understanding makes an important contribution to cognitive growth it also stresses the important part played by historical material in the emotional and imaginative life of the child concluding with a discussion of practical classroom methods the author proposes objectives and characteristic concepts of the subject which may be embodied in all levels of teaching

interdisciplinary teaching and sociocultural aspects this book covers all levels of education from primary school to tertiary education with a particular focus on teacher education additionally each chapter refers to and or is based on empirical research in order to support illuminate clarify and evaluate key issues main questions and conjectured theses raised by the authors or in the literature on the basis of historical epistemological or didactical cognitive arguments

this second volume of essays by professor kelley takes the study of history as its starting point then extends explorations into adjacent fields of legal political and social thought to confront some of the larger questions of the modern human sciences the first group of papers examine the historiography of the protestant reformation and then of the romantic and victorian periods the last section focuses on the legal tradition and its interpretation in relation to social and cultural as well as historical thought in the period from the renaissance to the french revolution throughout the author s interest is to analyse how people at different times have viewed their past and reconstructed and utilised it in the service of their present concerns

the studies of philosophy and history of education are under siege these studies do not attract large grant funds and to many do not seem useful even while much of educational research is dismissed as inconsequential or self evident and the crisis in american education deepens philosophy and history of education have therefore been pushed to the margin or beyond in colleges and schools of education commensurate with the decline of the humanities in higher education generally philosophy and history of education examines the complex relationship between these studies and the value of these related studies for improving educational knowledge policy and practice from diverse perspectives the philosophers and historians in this volume explore how bringing these disciplines together yields insights about unacknowledged or occult aspects of education problems that neither could achieve on their own
