whatever principles are imbibed at college will run thro a man s whole future conduct william livingston signer of the constitution schools for statesmen explores the fifty five individual framers of the constitution in close detail and argues that their different educations help explain their divergent positions at the 1787 constitutional convention those educations ranged from outlawed irish hedge schools to england s venerable inns of court from the grammar schools of new england to ambitious new academies springing up on the carolina frontier the more traditional schools that focused on greek and latin classics oxford harvard yale william and mary were deeply conservative institutions resistant to change but the scottish colleges and the newer american schools princeton philadelphia king s college introduced students to a scottish enlightenment curriculum that fostered more radical forward thinking leaders half of the framers had no college education and were often self taught or had private tutors most were quiet at the convention although a few stubbornly opposed the new ideas they were hearing nearly all the delegates who took the lead at the convention had been educated at the newer innovative colleges but of the seven who rejected the new constitution three had gone to the older traditional schools while three others had not gone to college at all schools for statesmen is an unprecedented analysis of the sharply divergent educations of the framers of the constitution it reveals the ways in which the constitutional convention rather than being a counterrevolution by conservative elites was dominated by forward thinking innovators who had benefited from the educational revolution beginning in the mid eighteenth century andrew browning offers a new and persuasive explanation of key disagreements among the framers and the process by which they were able to break through the impasse that threatened the convention he provides a fresh understanding of the importance of education in what has been called the critical period of us history schools for statesmen takes a deep dive into the diverse educational world of the eighteenth century and sheds new light on the origins of the us constitution

never expected that a former student of princeton and his own replacement during his hiatus in europe john w nevin would lead the german reformed church s seminary in a new and in his mind destructive direction the two along with their institutions would clash over philosophy and religion producing some of the best historical theology ever written in the united states the clash was broad influencing everything from hermeneutics to liturgy but at its core was the philosophical antagonism of princeton s scottish common sense perspective and the german speculative method employed by mercersburg both princeton and mercersburg were the cautious and critical beneficiaries of a century of european protestant science philosophy and theology and they were intent on adapting that legacy to the american religious context for princeton much of the new european thought was suspect in contrast mercersburg embraced a great deal of what the continent offered princeton followed a conservative path never straying far from the foundation established by locke they enshrined an evangelical perspective that would become a bedrock for conservative protestants to this day in contrast nevin and the mercersburg school were swayed by the advances in theological science made by germany s mediating school of theology they embraced a churchy idealism called evangelical catholicism and emphatically warned that the direction of princeton and with it protestant american religion and politics would grow increasingly subjective thus divided and absorbed with individual salvation they cautioned against the spirit of the growing evangelical bias toward personal religion as it led to sectarian disunity and they warned evangelicals not to confuse numerical success with spiritual success in contrast princeton was alarmed at the direction of european philosophy and theology and they resisted mercersburg with what today continues to be the fundamental teachings of evangelical theology princeton s appeal was in its common sense philosophical moorings which drew rapidly industrializing america into its arms mercersburg countered with a philosophically defended churchly idealism based on a speculative philosophy that effectively critiqued what many to this day find divisive and dangerous about america s current religious right

charles hodge 1797 1878 was one of nineteenth century america s leading theologians owing in part to a lengthy teaching career voluminous writings and a faculty post at one of the nation s most influential schools princeton theological seminary surprisingly the only biography of this towering figure was written by his son just two years after his death paul c gutjahr s book is the first modern critical biography of a man some have called the pope of presbyterianism hodge s legacy is especially important to american presbyterians his brand of theological conservatism became vital in the 1920s as princeton seminary saw itself and its denomination split the conservative wing held unswervingly to the old school tradition championed by hodge and ultimately founded the breakaway orthodox presbyterian church the views that hodge developed refined and propagated helped shape many of the central traditions of twentieth and twenty first century american evangelicalism hodge helped establish a profound reliance on the bible among evangelicals and he became one of the nation s most vocal proponents of biblical inerrancy gutjahr s study reveals the exceptional depth breadth and longevity of hodge s theological influence and illuminates the varied and complex nature of conservative american protestantism

This groundbreaking study explores how the fight between dispensationalists and covenant theologians got started and how a unique dynamic of personalities and sociological factors enflamed it. Readers may be surprised to discover that even the terminology of dispensationalists and covenant theologians originated in the 1930s. Disputes that the vast majority of the original protagonists on both sides were Presbyterians and that soteriology rather than eschatology was the original bone of contention between them. This study examines how two respective strands of fundamentalism came to identify one another as theological rivals as they each vied for position in their recently formed separatist bodies. The significance of disagreements over dispensationalism is explored in the founding of the Orthodox Presbyterian and Bible Presbyterian churches and then as the debate traveled southward. The response of the PCUS is examined with special attention given to the consummative report of an ad hoc committee that found dispensationalism to be out of harmony with the Westminster doctrinal standards. Significant misunderstandings that impeded fruitful dialogue from the beginning are clarified, particularly those that have persisted most stubbornly to the present day. Perhaps most surprising of all, the reader will discover that nearly all of the original points of debate between dispensationalists and

covenant theologians have since been resolved as each side has honed its position in light of pertinent critiques why has this development gone almost unnoticed this study suggests an answer and proposes that understanding how the feud began may hold the key to rapprochement today

distinguished intellectual historian paul conkin offers the first comprehensive examination of mainline protestantism in america from its emergence in the colonial era to its rise to predominance in the early nineteenth century and the beginnings of its gradual decline in the years preceding the civil war he clarifies theological traditions and doctrinal arguments and includes substantive discussions of institutional development and of the order and content of worship conkin defines reformed christianity broadly to encompass presbyterians episcopalians congregationalists methodists calvinist baptists and all other denominations originating in the work of reformers other than luther he portrays growing unease and conflict within this center of american protestantism before the civil war as a result of doctrinal disputes especially regarding salvation scholarly and scientific challenges to evangelical christianity differences in institutional practices and sectional disagreements related to the issue of slavery conkin grounds his study in a broad history of western christianity and he integrates the south into his discussion thereby offering a truly national perspective on the history of the reformed tradition in america
