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there are few better examples of analysis the critical thinking skill of understanding how an argument is built than robert dahl s democracy and its critics in this work the american political theorist closely analyzes the democratic political system and then evaluates whether the arguments that are in favor of it are in fact rigorous dahl sets out to describe democracy s merits and problems asking if it really is the worthwhile political system we believe it to be knowing that the idea of democracy is now almost universally popular his detailed analysis leads him to look at a number of regimes that claim to be democratic but do not in truth practice democracy but dahl is not only interested in uncovering uncomfortable truths he goes further and creates a set of standards by which we can all decide whether a country really is democratic dahl s analysis of the evidence leads him to conclude that the following criteria must be met for a regime to be considered truly democratic elected officials control policy making there are free and fair elections of officials everyone must have a right to vote everyone has the right to run for office there is freedom of speech alternative information is available and people can form free independent political groups

formal axiology and its critics consists of two parts both of which present criticisms of the formal theory of values developed by robert s hartman replies to these criticisms plus a short introduction to formal axiology part i consists of articles published or made public during the lifetime of hartman to which he personally replied it contains previously published replies to hector neri castañeda william eckhardt and robert s brumbaugh and previously unpublished replies to charles hartshorne rem b edwards robert e carter g r grice nicholas rescher robert w mueller gordon welty pete gunter and george k plochmann in an unfinished but now completed article on which hartman was working at the time of his death in 1973 part ii consists of articles presented at recent annual meetings of the r s hartman institute for formal and applied axiology that continue to criticize and further develop hartman s formal axiology an article by rem b

edwards raises serious unanswered questions about formal axiology and ethics another by frank g forrest shows how the formal value calculus based on set theory might answer these questions and an article by mark a moore points out weaknesses in the hartman forrest value calculus and develops an alternative calculus based upon the mathematics of quantum mechanics while recognizing that unsolved problems remain the book intends to make the theoretical foundations and future promise of formal axiology much more secure open access funding for this volume has been provided by the robert s hartman institute

the last decade saw the arrival of a new player in the creation evolution debate the intelligent design creationism idc movement whose strategy is to act as the wedge to overturn darwinism and scientific naturalism this anthology of writings by prominent creationists and their critics focuses on what is novel about the new movement it serves as a companion to robert pennock s tower of babel in which he criticizes the wedge movement as well as other new varieties of creationism the book contains articles previously published in specialized hard to find journals as well as new contributions each section contains introductory background information articles by influential creationists and their critics and in some cases responses by the creationists the discussions cover idc as a political movement idc s philosophical attack on evolution the theological debate over the apparent conflict between evolution and the bible idc s scientific claims and philosopher alvin plantinga s critique of naturalism and evolution the book concludes with pennock s why creationism should not be taught in the public schools

the market and its critics first published in 1988 considers the reaction of socialist writers to the growth of the market economy in nineteenth century britain and examines in detail the diverse elements of the critique which they

formulated dr thompson looks at the theoretic and thematic continuities and discontinuities over the century structuring his study around the idea of a changing socialist response to the market economy much of the literature in question is comprehensive perceptive and acute however the writers invariably discounted the possibility of the market playing a role in a future socialist or communist commonwealth the solutions they posited to the problem were inapplicable to the increasingly industrial economy of the time it was this that left their writing vulnerable to attack and which had profound consequences both for the fate of the socialist political economy in nineteenth century britain and its subsequent evolution in the twentieth century

first published in 1985 liberalism was under increasing attack from both socialists and conservatives towards the end of the twentieth century this book argues that far from having little to contribute towards solving the problems of the modern world liberalism is in fact of central importance it discusses the arguments against liberalism put forward by four major political theorists refuting the general thrust of their criticisms and taking issue with many points of detail used by them to support their arguments it analyses the origins of liberalism discusses its major achievements and explains why it continues to be a crucially important movement

a major and challenging work provocative and certain to be controversial will add important new dimension to the continuing debate on the decline of liberalism william julius wilson new york times book review can we continue to believe in progress in this sobering analysis of the western human condition christopher lasch seeks the answer in a history of the struggle between two ideas one is the idea of progress an idea driven by the conviction that human desire is insatiable and requires ever larger production forces opposing this materialist view is the idea that condemns a boundless appetite for more and better goods and distrusts improvements that only feed desire tracing the opposition to the idea of progress from rousseau through montesquieu to carlyle max weber and g d h cole lasch finds much that is desirable in a turn toward moral conservatism toward a lower middle class culture that features egalitarianism workmanship and loyalty and recognizes the danger of resentment of the material goods of others

the music reviews of robert schumann and richard wagner are central documents of 19th century german musical culture this book takes a closer look at the way these texts were written and explores the significant contributions schumann and wagner made to the discourse of musical appraisal to that effect the author raises fundamental questions that have thus far remained unaddressed what textual features characterize the critical writings how do schumann and wagner understand their roles as critics of music and in what way do they reach out to the reader rather

than understanding these critical writings exclusively as a gateway to the compositions and musical aesthetics of schumann and wagner this book analyzes the texts through the lens of pragmatics narratology and discourse analysis using this interdisciplinary perspective the author proposes to understand schumann and wagner within the broader medial and discursive context of german kritik he challenges the dominant narrative that brands schumann and wagner as elitist romantic critics demonstrating instead that they actively encourage their readers to form their own judgements this volume is an indispensable resource for scholars of german literature periodicals and music alike

augustine of hippo ad 354 430 is arguably the most controversial christian thinker in history his positions on philosophical and theological concerns have been the subjects of intense scrutiny and criticism from his lifetime to the present augustine and his critics gathers twelve specialists responses to modern criticisms of his thought covering personal and religious freedom the self and god sexuality gender and the body spirituality asceticism cultural studies and politics stimulating and insightful the collection offers forceful arguments for neglected historical philosophical and theological perspectives which are behind some of augustine s most unpopular convictions

realism has been the subject of critical scrutiny for some time and this examination aims to identify and define its strengths and shortcomings making a contribution to the study of international relations

emmanuel levinas 1905 1995 was one of the foremost thinkers of the twentieth century his work influencing a wide range of intellectuals such as maurice blanchot jacques derrida luce irigaray and jean luc marion

the australian national university s strategic defence studies centre sdsc is australia s premier university based strategic studies think tank fifty years after the centre was founded in 1966 sdsc celebrated its continued research

publications teaching and government advisory role with a two day conference entitled new directions in strategic thinking 20 the event saw the podium graced by many of the world's premier thinkers in the strategic studies field an evening between those tours to the lectern brought together academics practitioners and other honoured guests at a commemorative dinner held beneath the widespread wings of the g for george bomber in the Australian War Memorial an event that included SDSC's own professor Desmond Ball AO making his last public appearance since SDSC's 25th anniversary the world has seen the collapse of the Soviet Union and the end of the cold war bipolarity gave way to the emergence of the United States as the world's sole superpower a status many now see as under threat both the nature of the threats and identity of individual competitors has changed in the interim quarter century non state actors are presenting rising challenges to national governments meanwhile a diminished Russia and far more wealthy China seek to reassert themselves never before has the call for reasoned innovative security studies thinking been more pronounced rarely has a group so able to offer that thought come together as was the case in July 2016 this book encapsulates the essence of this cutting edge thinking and is a must read for those concerned with emerging strategic challenges facing Australia and its security partners

Robert O Keohane's *After Hegemony* is both a classic of international relations scholarship and an example of how creative thinking can help shed new light on the world since the end of World War II the global political landscape had been dominated by two superpowers the USA and the USSR and the tense stand off of the cold war but as the cold war began to thaw it became clear that a new global model might emerge the commonly held belief amongst those studying international relations was that it was impossible for nations to work together without the influence of a hegemon a dominant international power to act as both referee and ultimate decision maker this paradigm neorealism worked on the basis that every nation will do all it can to maximize its power with such processes only checked by a balance of competing powers Keohane however examined the evidence afresh and came up with novel explanations for what was likely to come next he went outside the dominant paradigm and argued for what came to be known as the neoliberal conception of international politics states Keohane said can and will cooperate without the influence of a hegemonic power so long as doing so brings them absolute gains in the shape of economic and cultural benefits in Keohane's highly creative view the pursuit of national self interest leads naturally to international cooperation and to the formation of global regimes such as the United Nations that can reinforce and foster it

Scholars of religion have always been fascinated by asceticism some have even regarded this radical way of life the withdrawal from the world combined with practices that seriously affect basic bodily needs up to extreme forms of self

mortification as the ultimate form of a true religious quest this view is rooted in hagiographic descriptions of prominent ascetics and in other literary accounts that praise the ascetic life style scholars have often overlooked however that in the history of religions ascetic beliefs and practices have also been strongly criticized by followers of the same religious tradition as well as by outsiders the respective sources provide sufficient evidence of such critical strands but surprisingly as yet no attempt has been made to analyze this criticism of asceticism systematically this book is a first attempt of filling this gap ten studies present cases from both asian and european traditions classical and medieval hinduism early and contemporary buddhism in south and east asia european antiquity early and medieval christianity and 19th 20th century aryan religion focusing on the critics of asceticism their motives their arguments and the targets of their critique these studies provide a broad range of issues for comparison they suggest that the critique of asceticism is based on a worldview differing from and competing with the ascetic worldview often in one and the same historical context the book demonstrates that examining the critics of asceticism helps understand better the complexity of religious traditions and their cultural contexts the comparative analysis moreover shows that the criticism of asceticism reflects a religious worldview as significant and widespread in the history of religions as asceticism itself is

bringing biology to life is a guided tour of the philosophy of biology canvassing three broad areas the early history of biology from aristotle to darwin traditional debates regarding species function and units of selection and recent efforts to better understand the human condition in light of evolutionary biology topics are addressed using no more technical jargon than necessary and without presupposing any advanced knowledge of biology or the philosophy of science on the part of the reader discussion questions are also provided to encourage reader reflection

in this book john w woell shows us how contemporary readings of american pragmatism founded on mistakenly used categories of the analytic tradition have led to misreadings of peirce and james by focusing on terms drawn largely from descartes and kant contemporary debates between metaphysical realists antirealists realists and nonrealists have argues woell failed to shed great light on pragmatism in general and a pragmatic philosophy of religion in particular woell contends that paying close attention to the internal relationships among inquiry belief and their objects in the respective works of peirce and james provides a means for fully appreciating pragmatism s richness as a resource for philosophy of religion by taking account of a pragmatic point of view in philosophy of religion this book incites a more productive discussion of the metaphysical status of religious objects and of the epistemic status of religious belief

annotation by using the core insights of the constructivist approach in international relations this book analyses the foreign policy behaviour of turkey the author argues that turkey s western identity has influenced its foreign policy formulation and implementation since the war of independence
