from shambling zombies to gothic ghosts horror has entertained thrill seeking readers for centuries a versatile literary genre it offers commentary on societal issues fresh insight into the everyday and moral tales disguised in haunting tropes and grotesque acts with many stories worthy of critical appraisal this collection of new essays takes in a range of topics focusing on historic works such as ann radcliffe s gaston de blondeville 1826 and modern novels including max brooks world war z other contributions examine weird fiction stephen king richard laymon indigenous australian monster mythology and horror in picture books for young children

the gothic is wildly diverse it can refer to ecclesiastical architecture supernatural fiction cult horror films and a distinctive style of rock music it has influenced political theorists and social reformers as well as victorian home d®cor and contemporary fashion nick groom shows how the gothic has come to encompass so many meanings by telling the story of the gothic from the ancient tribe who sacked rome to the alternative subculture of the present day this unique very short introduction reveals that the gothic has predominantly been a way of understanding and responding to the past time after time the gothic has been invoked in order to reveal what lies behind conventional history it is a way of disclosing secrets whether in the constitutional politics of seventeenth century england or the racial politics of the united states while contexts change the gothic perpetually regards the past with fascination both yearning and horrified it reminds us that neither societies nor individuals can escape the consequences of their actions the anatomy of the gothic is richly complex and perversely contradictory and so the thirteen chapters here range deliberately widely this is the first time that the entire

story of the gothic has been written as a continuous history from the historians of late antiquity to the gardens of georgian england from the mediaeval cult of the macabre to german expressionist cinema from elizabethan revenge tragedy to american consumer society from folk ballads to vampires from the past to the present about the series the very short introductions series from oxford university press contains hundreds of titles in almost every subject area these pocket sized books are the perfect way to get ahead in a new subject quickly our expert authors combine facts analysis perspective new ideas and enthusiasm to make interesting and challenging topics highly readable

the gothic and twenty first century american popular culture examines the gothic mode deployed in a variety of texts that touch upon inherently us american themes demonstrating its versatility and ubiquity across genres and popular media the volume is divided into four main thematic sections spanning representations related to ethnic minorities bodily monstrosity environmental anxieties and haunted technology the chapters explore both overtly gothic texts and pop culture artifacts that despite not being widely considered strictly so rely on gothic strategies and narrative devices

examines spain s contribution to international interest in gothic culture film and literaturewith the success of novels such as the shadow of the wind and films like the others contemporary spanish culture has contributed a great deal to the imagery and experience of the gothic although such contributions are not always recognised as being specifically spanish in origin contemporary spanish gothic is the first book to study how the gothic mode intersects with cultural production in spain today considering some of the ways in which such production feeds off and simultaneously feeds into gothic production more widely examining the works of writers and filmmakers like carlos ruiz zafan arturo pa c rez reverte pedro almodavar and alejandro amena bar as well as the further reaches of spanish gothic influence in the twilight film series

the book considers images and themes like the mad surgeon and the vulnerable body the role of the haunted house and the heritage biopics of francisco de goya

the book reads the gothic characteristics of australian cinema within their national cultural context the book relates the key motifs and concerns of gothic literature to the styles narratives and significance of australian films the book places examples of australian gothic film within the australian filmmaking and film criticism and relates these to the wider trends of international horror film

both the inception and development of this important publication as well as its stories misty ran for 101 issues as a stand alone publication between 1978 and 1980 and then four more years as part of tammy it was a hugely successful anthology comic containing one shot and serialized stories of supernatural horror and fantasy aimed at girls and young women and featuring work by writers and artists who dominated british comics such as pat mills malcolm shaw and john armstrong as well as celebrated european artists to this day misty remains notable for its daring and sophisticated stories strong female characters innovative page layouts and big visuals in the first book on this topic round closely analyzes misty s content including its creation and production its cultural and historical context key influences and the comic itself largely based on round s own archival research the study also draws on interviews with many of the key creators involved in this comic including pat mills wilf prigmore and its art editorial team jack cunningham and ted andrews who have never previously spoken about their work richly illustrated with previously unpublished photos scripts and letters this book uses misty as a lens to explore the use of gothic themes and symbols in girls comics and other media it surveys existing work on childhood and gothic and offers a working definition of gothic for girls a subgenre which challenges and instructs readers in a number of ways

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
