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the thirteen contributions to this collection all explore or exemplify the ongoing british interest in the socialist world before 1990 in autobiography fiction film history and lexicography these chapters show how contemporary britain is engaging with the past project to build socialism in europe and what this means for the present and the future of our continent contributions come from a wide range of disciplinary and geographical backgrounds and the volume is further enriched by a short story especially written for this book and by an in depth interview with the author of a recent popular history of the gdr together these chapters offer a unique perspective into contemporary british writing on the second world and the enduring fascination with the failures of futures past

Frege's puzzle concerning belief reports has been in the middle of the discussion on semantics and pragmatics of attitude reports the intuition behind the opacity does not seem to be consistent with the thesis of semantic innocence according to which the semantic value of proper names is nothing but their referent main tasks of this book include providing truth conditional content of belief reports especially the focus is on semantic values of proper names the key aim is to extend Crimmins's basic idea of semantic pretense and the introduction of pleonastic entities proposed by Schiffer they enable us to capture Frege's puzzle in the analysis without giving up semantic innocence to reach this conclusion two issues are established first based on linguistic evidence the frame of belief reports functions adverbially rather than relationally second the belief ascriptions on which each belief report is made must be analyzed in terms of the measurement theoretic analogy

A major obstacle for materialist theories of the mind is the problem of sensory consciousness how could a physical brain produce conscious sensory states that exhibit the rich and luxurious qualities of red velvet a Mozart concerto or fresh brewed coffee caging the beast a theory of sensory consciousness offers to explain what these conscious sensory states have in common by virtue of being conscious as opposed to unconscious states after arguing against accounts of consciousness in terms of higher order representation of mental states the theory claims that sensory consciousness is a special way we have of representing the world the book also introduces a way of thinking about subjectivity as separate and more fundamental than consciousness and considers how this foundational notion can be developed into more elaborate varieties an appendix reviews the connection between consciousness and attention with an eye toward providing a neuropsychological instantiation of the proposed theory series a
