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first published in 1998 this is volume ix of the fifteen in the sociology of law and criminology series this is a collection of mainly previously published periodicals articles reports or reviews on group problems in crime and punishment the material has throughout been revised in 1955 and brought up to date by adding brief introductory or concluding remarks and further references to recent legislation literature and other subsequent developments

heroin organized crime and the making of modern turkey explores the history of organized crime in turkey and the roles which gangs and gangsters have played in the making of the turkish state and turkish politics turkey s underworld which has been at the heart of several devastating scandals over the last several decades is strongly tied to the country s long history of opium production and heroin trafficking as an industry at the centre of the ottoman empire s long transition into the modern turkish republic as important as the silk road had been in earlier centuries the modern rise of the opium and heroin trade helped to solidify and complicate long standing relationships between state officials and criminal syndicates such relationships produced not only ongoing patterns of corruption but helped fuel and enable repeated acts of state violence drawing upon new archival sources from the united states and turkey including declassified documents from the prime minister s archives of the republic of turkey and the central intelligence agency heroin organized crime and the making of modern turkey provides a critical window into how a handful of criminal syndicates played supporting roles in the making of national security politics in the contemporary turkey the rise of the turkish mafia from its origins in the late ottoman period to its role in the deep state revealed by the so called susurluk and ergenekon scandals is a story that mirrors troubling elements in the republic s establishment and emphasizes the transnational and comparative significance of narcotics and gangs in the country s past

in developmental theories of crime and delinquency terence p thornberry and his contributors show that criminal behavior is not a static human attribute but ebbs and flows over the life

course of the individual criminal behavior tends to follow a distinct psychological pattern it is relatively uncommon during childhood is initiated by most offenders during adolescence flourishes during late adolescence and early adulthood and usually diminishes or disappears by the mid twenties this pattern is not characteristic of all people some never commit crimes and others become career criminals but it is a general description of the developmental pattern of criminal offenders this pattern has profound implications for theories of crime and delinquency not only does it explain initiation into maintenance of and desistance from involvement in crime it offers insight into why crime flourishes during adolescence traditional theories of crime and delinquency have often failed to distinguish among different phases of criminal careers they tend to ignore developmental changes that occur across a person's life course changes that coincide with and can explain the causes and patterns of criminal behavior this paperback edition of the seventh volume of the distinguished series advances in criminological theory moves us from static identifications of the criminal by presenting a broad range of developmental explanations of crime each contributor articulates a developmental or life course perspective in explaining how people become involved in delinquency and crime each covers a wide range of theoretical territory and reveals how a developmental perspective enhances the explanatory power of traditional theories of crime and delinquency this volume is an invaluable tool for criminologists sociologists psychologists and other professionals seeking to teach how crime and violence can be understood in our culture

public place whatever its nature a park a mall a train platform or a street corner is where people pass by meet each other and at times become a victim of crime with this book we submit that crime and safety in public places are not issues that can be easily dealt with within the boundaries of a single discipline the book aims to illustrate the complexity of patterns of crime and fear in public places with examples of studies on these topics contextualized in different cities and countries around the world this is achieved by tackling five cross cutting themes the nature of the city s environment as a backdrop for crime and fear the dynamics of individuals daily routines and their transit safety the safety perceptions experienced by those who are most in fear in public places the metrics of crime and fear and finally examples of current practices in promoting safety all these original chapters contribute to our quest for safer more inclusive resilient equitable and sustainable cities and human settlements aligned to the global 2030 agenda for sustainable development

while the link between crime and schizophrenia has been noted for almost a century it is only recently that research has provided convincing broad based evidence for this association this advance in knowledge also brings with it the troublesome danger that schizophrenia patients could be doubly stigmatised in society they suffer from a serious mental illness and furthermore they are potentially dangerous this understandable fear has both lead to significant resistance in accepting that the crime schizophrenia relationship truly exists while well meaning this resistance has resulted in three unfortunate consequences first by not recognising that the relationship exists the comorbid antisocial and violent behaviour of schizophrenia patients has gone unchecked and consequently the stigma associated with this comorbidity goes on unabated second research in this area has become almost fixated on the simple establishment of a link between the two conditions and has not moved on to more important research that could help develop new perspectives on the nature of the crime schizophrenia relationship in a way which will significantly benefit our understanding and treatment of both conditions frustratingly we actually know surprisingly little about the crime schizophrenia relationship the third and more indirect consequence is that the issue of schizophrenia spectrum disorder in antisocial criminal populations is almost entirely ignored such individuals literally fall between the cracks in both the mental health system and the criminal justice system for these reasons it is argued that ignoring or denying the crime schizophrenia relationship ultimately does more

harm than good the main goal of this book is to stimulate a new generation of research on the crime schizophrenia relationship which could benefit not just individuals with these two conditions but also society in general going beyond the fundamental issue of whether there is a relationship between crime and schizophrenia contributors to this book both outline risk factors for crime and schizophrenia and also develop hypotheses on which factors may give rise to both conditions and hence in part explain the comorbidity issue furthermore contributors go on to outlining intervention and prevention programs for not just crime and schizophrenia but also for both conditions simultaneously from the preface

in this volume authors draw from theoretical and methodological frameworks in the health social and behavioral sciences to illustrate how poor outcomes among individuals and communities can be linked to the interplay of multiple factors operating at various levels

one of the dark sides to democratization can be crime and corruption this book looks at the way political liberalization affects these practices in a number of ways whilst also challenging some of the scare stories about democracy the book also brings the politics of power back into an examination of corruption

the social construction of crime is often out of proportion to the threat posed the media and advocacy groups shine a spotlight on some crimes and ignore others street crime is highlighted

as putting everyone at risk of victimization while the greater social harms from corporate malfeasance receive far less attention social arrangements dictate what is defined as crime and the punishments for those who engage in the proscribed behavior interest groups promote their agendas by appealing to public fears justifications often have no basis in fact but the public accepts the exaggerations and blames the targeted offenders the net widening effect of more laws and more punishment catches those least able to defend themselves this innovative alternative to traditional textbooks provides insightful observations of myths and trends in criminal justice fourteen chapters challenge misconceptions about specific crimes or aspects of the criminal justice system kappeler and potter dissect popular images of crimes and criminals in a cogent compelling and engaging manner they trace the social construction of each issue and identify the misleading statistics and fears that form the basis of myths and the collateral damage of basing policies on mythical beliefs the authors encourage skepticism about commonly accepted beliefs offer readers a fresh perspective and urge them to analyze important issues from novel vantage points

this book centres on the forms of participation in crime set out in the rome statute but it is definitely not a simple repetition or summary of the views expressed in the icc case law instead the work critically elaborates on the icc practice and presents a theoretical and dogmatic description of modes of criminal responsibility that might be found in the statute the element of novelty is however brought about by the methodology which encompasses a normative analysis based on the distinction between the categories of sanctioned and sanctioning norms initially introduced by k binding in the german doctrine but for the purposes of this book adjusted to the structure of international core crimes and reconciling them with the grounds for criminal responsibility as such moreover the work does not avoid bold assertions concerning the norms of participation in crime concerning inter alia the concept of spectator or public approval and or direct incitement to genocide this approach should be of particular interest to those who are under the impression that international criminal law is entangled in a multiplicity of labels and the judicial practice sometimes adopts the same requirements without any further thought or analysis the book aims to trigger a broader debate on the merits and rationale of participation in crime and encourages readers to rethink

some of the concepts developed within judicial practice the work also takes into consideration the icc case law in particular some tendencies that might be inferred from the separate and concurring opinions in the ntaganda case all in all it endeavours to reflect on the content of article 25 3 and 28 of the rome statute and provide an answer on how icc practice might and perhaps should evolve further aleksandra nieprzecka ph d is a member of the polish bar association in kraków and worked as a principal researcher in the project concerning the model of participation in crime adopted in the rome statute carried out at the jagiellonian university in kraków where she finished her doctoral studies according to the co tutelle agreement between the jagiellonian university in kraków and the university of hamburg

the problems associated with groups that commit crime are well known and notoriously complex however there are many questions that we still cannot answer with certainty this book seeks to deepen understanding of the group processes involved in crime and the treatment of offenders thoughts and behaviour together the chapters in this volume address the following questions are people more likely to commit crime because of the influence of their group does group membership cause people to become criminals or does the group merely foster people s pre existing criminal inclinations how does group membership exert such a strong hold on people so that some risk imprisonment or even death rather than relinquish their membership the contributors to crime and crime reduction consider the social psychological influences of groups and specific forms of group crime such as street and prison gangs terrorism organized criminal networks and group sexual offending the book also addresses important questions about the role of groups in treating offenders and why existing group membership should be considered when treating offenders group criminal activity is a key area of study for researchers and for students of forensic psychology and criminology courses this book will therefore be of interest to students scholars and law enforcement practitioners who want to understand the group processes involved in crime and its reduction

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
