in 2010 cartoon network debuted a new animated series called adventure time and within just a few short years the show became both a pop culture phenomenon and a critical darling but despite all the admiration not many works of scholarship have assessed the show through a critical lens this anthology is an attempt to fill this scholarly oversight and spark a wider conversation about the show s deeper themes across 15 scholarly essays this book s contributors study

adventure time from a variety of angles proving just how insightful the series really is from a consideration of bmo s queer identity to a psychoanalytic reading of lemongrab and an examination of how anime has impacted the show the topics explored in this anthology are diverse and unique and are likely to appeal to scholars and fans alike

created around the world and available only on the internet television series are independently produced mostly low budget shows that often feature talented but unknown performers typically financed through crowd funding they are filmed with borrowed equipment and volunteer casts and crews and viewers find them through word of mouth or by chance the third of five volumes on internet tv series this book covers 335 alphabetically arranged gay and lesbian programs 1996 2014 giving casts credits story lines episode descriptions websites dates and commentary a complete index lists program titles and headings for gay lesbian bi sexual transgender and drag queen shows

teaching in times of crisis explores how comparative methods which are instrumental in reading and teaching works of literature from around the world also provide us with tools to dissect and engage the moments of crises that permeate our contemporary political realities the book is written in the form of a series of classroom reflections or memos capturing the political environment preceding and proceeding the 2016 us presidential election it examines the ways in which the ethics involved in reading comparatively can be employed by teachers and students alike to map and foster lifelines for cultural sustainability to borrow the term from djelal kadir s memos from the besieged city that are essential for creating and maintaining a healthy multicultural society nyawalo achieves this through comparative readings of postcolonial films lgbtq texts french slam poetry as well as episodes from star trek the next generation among other materials the classroom reflections captured in each memo are shaped by the appalachian setting in which the discussions and lessons took place inspired by this setting the author develops pedagogic ethics of comparison a method of reading comparatively which privileges the local educational spaces in which students find themselves by mapping the contested cultural politics of appalachian realities onto a world literature curriculum

the comic event approaches comedy as dynamic phenomenon that involves the gathering of elements of performance signifiers timings tones gestures previous comic bits and other self conscious structures into an event that triggers by virtue of a cut an expected unexpected resolution using examples from mainstream comedy the comic event progresses

from the smallest comic moment jokes bits to the more complex caricatures sketches sit coms parody films and stand up routines judith roof builds on side comments from henri bergson s short treatise laughter sigmund freud s jokes and their relation to the unconscious and various observations from aristotle to establish comedy as a complex multifaceted practice in seeing comedy as a gathering event that resolves with a cut roof characterizes comedy not only by a predictable unpredictability occasioned by a sudden expected unexpected insight but also by repetition seriality self consciousness self referentiality and an ourobouric return to a previous cut this theory of comedy offers a way to understand the operation of a broad array of distinct comic occasions and aspects of performance in multiple contexts

from its crudely drawn vignettes on the tracey ullman show to its nearly 700 episodes the simpsons has evolved from an alternative programming experiment to a worldwide cultural phenomenon at 30 seasons and counting the simpsons boasts the distinction as the longest running fictional primetime series in the history of american television broadcast around the globe the show s viewers relate to a plethora of iconic characters from homer marge lisa maggie and bart to kwik e mart proprietor apu bar owner moe school principal seymour skinner and conniving businessman montgomery burns among many others in the simpsons a cultural history moritz fink explores the show s roots profiles its most popular characters and examines the impact the series has had not only its shaping of american culture but its pivotal role in the renaissance of television animation fink traces the show s comic forerunners dating back to early twentieth century comic strips as well as subversive publications like mad magazine and examines how the show in turn generated a new wave of animation that changed the television landscape drawing on memorable scenes and providing useful background details this book combines cultural analysis with intriguing trivia in addition to an appreciation of the show s landmark episodes the simpsons a cultural history offers an entertaining discussion of the series that will appeal to both casual fans and devoted aficionados of this groundbreaking program

pastsurveys the whole range of time travel stories on the small screen the essays in this collection explore time travel series both familiar babylon 5 stargate sg 1 and forgotten the time tunnel voyagers as well as time travel themed episodes and arcs in series where it is not central such as red dwarf lost and heroes contributors to this volume consider some of the classic themes of time travel stories the promise and peril of fixing the past the chance to experience and choose possible futures and the potential for small changes to have great effects exploring time travel as a teaching tool as a vehicle for moral lessons and as a background for high adventure this book offers new perspectives on many familiar programs and the first serious study of several unjustly neglected ones time travel television is essential reading for science fiction scholars and fans and for anyone interested in the many ways that television brings the fantastic into viewers living rooms

key debates of contemporary cultural sociology the rise of the cultural omnivore the fate of classical highbrow culture the popularization commercialization and globalization of culture deal with temporal changes yet systematic research about these processes is scarce due to the lack of suitable longitudinal data this book explores these questions through the lens of a crucial institution of cultural mediation the culture sections in quality european newspapers from 1960 to 2010 starting from the framework of cultural stratification and employing systematic content analysis both quantitative and qualitative of more than 13 000 newspaper articles enter culture exit arts presents a synthetic yet empirically rich and detailed account of cultural transformation in europe over the last five decades it shows how classifications and hierarchies of culture have changed in course of the process towards increased cultural heterogeneity furthermore it conceptualizes the key trends of rising popular culture and declining highbrow arts as two simultaneous processes the one of legitimization of popular culture and the other of popularization of traditional legitimate culture both important for the loosening of the boundary between highbrow and popular through careful comparative analysis and illustrative snapshots into the specific socio historical contexts in which the newspapers and their representations of culture are embedded in finland france spain sweden turkey and the uk the book reveals the key patterns and diversity of european variations in the transformation of cultural hierarchies since the 1960s the book is a collective endeavour of a large scale international research project active between 2013 and 2018

rod serling s pioneering series thetwilight zone 1959 to 1964 is remembered for its surprise twist endings and pervading sense of irony while other american television series of the time also experimented with ironic surprises none depended on these as much as serling s however irony was not used merely as a structural device serling and his writers used it as a provocative means by which to comment on the cultural landscape of the time irony in the twilight zone how the series critiqued postwar american culture explores the multiple types of irony such as technological invasive martial sociopolitical and domestic that serling richard matheson charles beaumont and other contributors employed in the show david melbye explains how each kind of irony critiqued of a specific aspect of american culture and how all of them informed one another creating a larger social commentary this book also places the show s use of irony in historical and philosophical contexts connecting it to a rich cultural tradition reaching back to ancient greece the twilight zone endures because it uses irony to negotiate its definitively modernist moment of high social consciousness and low cultural escapism with its richly detailed frequently unexpected readings of episodes irony in the twilight zone offers scholars and

as one of the most influential shows of all time star trek continues to engage fans around the world but its cultural impact has grown far beyond the scope of the original seventy nine episodes the show spawned an unprecedented progeny beginning with star trek the next generation followed by three additional series of space exploration film versions featuring captain kirk mr spock and other original crew members first appeared in 1979 followed by a number of successful sequels and ultimately a reboot of the original show from the modest ambitions of the show s creator gene roddenberry star trek gradually transformed into a true franchise an expanded universe that continues to grow in the star trek universe franchising the final frontier douglas and sheat brode have collected several essays that examine the many incarnations that have arisen since the original program concluded its run in 1969 every aspect of media into which star trek has penetrated is covered in this collection the four television shows literature toys games and the big screen reboot of the original series featuring the enterprise and her crew essays address a number of elements particularly how the franchise has had an impact on gaming fandom and even technology other essays consider how race gender and sexuality have been addressed by the various shows and films after a half century of boldly exploring topical issues that concern all of humanity star trek warrants serious attention now more than ever looking beyond the entertainment value of its many versions the star trek universe a companion volume to gene roddenberry s star trek offers provocative essays that will engage scholars of gender studies race studies religion history and popular culture not to mention the show s legions of fans around the planet
