

Innovations In Hospital Architecture By Verderber Stephen 2010 Hardcover

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the new edition of this acclaimed book comprehensively updates its timely advocacy of the need for good quality palliative care today more necessary than ever rooted in the social history of the care of the elderly and terminally ill modern hospice design the architecture of palliative and social care takes cognisance of the new conditions of social care in the 21st century principally in the uk europe and north america it does so with regard to the development of new building types but also in response to new philosophies of palliative care and the status of the elderly and the dying benefitting from a clearer methodological approach and conceptual framework the expanded book allows a broad section of readers to navigate the text more easily at its core is a public discussion of a philosophy of design for providing care for the elderly and the vulnerable taking the importance of architectural aesthetics the use of quality materials the porousness of design to the wider world and the integration of indoor and outdoor spaces as part of the overall care environment in doing so it advocates care settings that in the words of maggie jencks whose life and ideas inspired the maggie s centres rise to the occasion including new chapters and new in depth case studies complete with full colour illustrations this book is for architects and interior designers and their students healthcare professionals social care providers estate and facility managers hospital administrators and healthcare trust boards

winner of a nautilus 2018 silver medal book award innovations in behavioural health architecture is the most comprehensive book written on this topic in more than 40 years it examines the ways in which healthcare architecture can contribute as a highly valued informational and reference source to the provision of psychiatric and addictive disorder treatment in communities around the world it provides an overview of the need for a new

generation of progressively planned and designed treatment centres both inpatient and outpatient care environments and the advantages challenges and opportunities associated with meeting the burgeoning need for treatment settings of this type additional chapters address the specifics of geriatric psychiatry and its architectural ramifications in light of the rapid aging of societies globally and provide a comprehensive compendium of planning and design considerations for these places in both inpatient and outpatient care contexts finally the book presents an expansive and fully illustrated set of international case studies that express state of the art advancements in architecture for behavioural healthcare

more than any other building type in the twentieth century the hospital was connected to transformations in the health of populations and expectations of lifespan from the scale of public health to the level of the individual the architecture of the modern hospital has reshaped knowledge about health and disease and perceptions of bodily integrity and security however the rich and genuinely global architectural history of these hospitals is poorly understood and largely forgotten this book explores the rapid evolution of hospital design in the twentieth century analysing the ways in which architects and other specialists reimagined the modern hospital it examines how the vast expansion of medical institutions over the course of the century was enabled by new approaches to architectural design and it highlights the emerging political conviction that physical health would become the cornerstone of human welfare

studying and promoting the well being of children is an interdisciplinary task furthermore it has a strong ethical component since it is connected to the questions of good life and just society in this book philosophers and social scientists approach the issue in close dialogue and shed light on some of the most challenging matters involved

in its constructive and speculative nature design has the critical potential to reshape prevalent socio material realities at the same time design is inevitably normative if not often violent as it stabilises the past normalises the present and precludes just and sustainable futures the contributions rethink concepts of critique that influence the field of design question inherent blind spots of the discipline and expand understandings of what critical design practices could be with contributions from design theory practice and education art theory philosophy and informatics critical by design aims to question and unpack the ambivalent tensions between design and critique

gentrification is extensively discussed in the media where coverage can describe changing neighbourhoods and analyse the causes and consequences of such change the media are also arenas in which the voices of those who advocate or resist gentrification can be heard how can this profusion of content be examined what methods can be used to critically address the role of the media in constructing and propagating discourses on gentrification central to this book is the idea that new research should engage with the theoretical and methodological issues that emerge when media products are used as a corpus to study gentrification

while the modern science of medicine often seems nothing short of miraculous religion still plays an important role in the past and present of many hospitals when three quarters of americans believe that god can cure people who have been given little or no chance of survival by their doctors how do today s technologically sophisticated health care organizations address spirituality and faith through a combination of interviews with nurses doctors and chaplains across the united states and close observation of their daily routines wendy cadge takes readers inside major academic medical institutions to explore how today s doctors and hospitals address prayer and other forms of religion and spirituality from chapels to intensive care units to the morgue hospital caregivers speak directly in these pages about how religion is part of their daily work in visible and invisible ways in paging god religion in the halls of medicine cadge shifts attention away from the ongoing controversy about whether faith and spirituality should play a role in health care and back to the many ways that these powerful forces already function in healthcare today

this collection opens up spaces where lives end bodies are disposed of and memories generated hospitals hospices care homes coroners courts funeral premises cemeteries roadsides the spirit world using material culture studies it illuminates the ways human beings make meaningful the challenges of death dying and bereavement

from sentimental stories about polio to the latest cherub in hospital commercials sick children tug at the public s heartstrings however sick children have not always had adequate medical care or protection the essays in children s issues in historical perspective investigate the identification prevention and treatment of childhood diseases from the 1800s onwards in areas ranging from french colonial vietnam to nineteenth century northern british columbia from new zealand fresh air camps to american health fairs themes include the role of government and or the private sector in initiating and underwriting child public health programs the growth of the profession of pediatrics and its views on proper mothering techniques the role of nationalism as well as ethnic and racial dimensions in child saving movements normative behaviour social control and the treatment of deviant children and adolescents poverty wealth and child health measures and the development of the modern children s hospital this liberally illustrated collection reflects the growing academic interest in all aspects of childhood especially child health and originates from health care professionals and scholars across the disciplines an introduction by the editors places the historical themes in context and offers an overview of the contemporary study of children s health

music best resonates provides multiple connections between the city's spaces its complex culture and its future drawing on the late tulane architect malcolm heard's ideas about interstitial spaces this collection examines how a variety of literal and represented in between spaces in new orleans have addressed race class gender community and environment as scholars of architecture art african american studies english history jazz philosophy and sociology the authors incorporate materials from architectural history and practice literary texts paintings drawings music dance and even statistical analyses interstitial space refers not only to functional elements inside and outside of many new orleans houses high ceilings hidden staircases galleries and courtyards but also to compelling spatial relations between the city's houses streets and neighborhoods rich with visual materials sweet spots reveals the ways that diverse new orleans spaces take on meanings and accrete stories that promote certain consequences both for those who live in them and for those who read such stories the volume evokes preserves criticizes and amends understanding of a powerful and often missed feature of new orleans's elusive reality

connecticut boasts some of the oldest and most distinctive architecture in new england from colonial churches and modernist houses to refurbished nineteenth century factories the state's history includes landscapes of small farmsteads country churches urban streets tobacco sheds quiet maritime villages and town greens as well as more recent suburbs and corporate headquarters in his guide to this rich and diverse architectural heritage christopher wigren introduces readers to 100 places across the state written for travelers and residents alike the book features buildings visible from the road featuring more than 200 illustrations the book is organized thematically sections include concise entries that treat notable buildings neighborhoods and communities emphasizing the importance of the built environment and its impact on our sense of place the text highlights key architectural features and trends and relates buildings to the local and regional histories they represent there are suggestions for further reading and a helpful glossary of architectural terms a project of the connecticut trust for historic preservation the book reflects more than 30 years of fieldwork and research in statewide architectural survey and national register of historic places programs

this book explores how the weather and city form impact the mind and how city form and mind interact it builds on merleau ponty's contention that mind the human body and the environment are intertwined in a singular composite and on walter benjamin's suggestion that mind and city form in mutual interaction through history have set the course of civilization bringing together the fields of philosophy urbanism geography history and architecture the book shows the association of existentialism with prevalence of mood disorder in northern europe at the close of little ice age it explains the implications of city form and traces the role of

the myths and allegories of urban design as well as the history of gender projection onto city form it shows how urbanization in northern europe provided easier access to shelter yet resulted in sunlight deprivation and yielded increasing incidence of depression and other mental disorder among the european middle class the book uses the examples of kierkegaard nietzsche dostoevsky and kafka to show how walking through the streets squares and other urban voids became the informal remedy to mood disorder a prominent trait among founders of modern existentialism it concludes by describing how the connection of anguish and violence is relevant to winter depression in cities in north america in particular

a surprising look at how hospitals affect and are affected by their surrounding communities an enduring paradox of urban public health is that many communities around hospitals are economically distressed and counterintuitively medically underserved in the city and the hospital two sociologists jonathan r wynn and berkeley franz and a political scientist daniel skinner track the multiple causes of this problem and offer policy solutions focusing on three urban hospitals connecticut s hartford hospital the flagship of the hartford healthcare system the cleveland clinic which coordinates with other providers for routine care while its main campus provides specialty care and the university of colorado hospital a rare example of an urban institution that relocated to a new community the authors analyze the complicated relationship between a hospital and its neighborhoods on the one hand hospitals anchor the communities that surround them often staying in a neighborhood for decades hospitals also craft strategies to engage with the surrounding community many of those focused on buying locally and hiring staff from their surrounding area on the other hand hospitals will often only provide care to the neighboring community through emergency departments reserving advanced medical care and long term treatment for those who can pay a premium for it in addition the authors show hospitals frequently buy neighborhood real estate and advocate for development programs that drive gentrification and displacement to understand how urban healthcare institutions work with their communities the authors address power history race and urbanity as much as the workings of the medical industry these varied initiatives and effects mean that understanding urban hospitals requires seeing them in a new light not only as medical centers but as complicated urban forces

death and the migrant is a sociological account of transnational dying and care in british cities it chronicles two decades of the ageing and dying of the uk s cohort of post war migrants as well as more recent arrivals chapters of oral history and close ethnographic observation enriched by photographs take the reader into the submerged worlds of end of life care in hospices hospitals and homes while honouring singular lives and storytelling death and the migrant explores the social economic and cultural landscapes that surround the migrant deathbed in the twenty first century here everyday challenges the struggle to belong relieve pain love well and maintain dignity and faith provide a fresh perspective on concerns and debates about the vulnerability of the body transnationalism care and hospitality blending narrative accounts from dying people and care professionals with insights from philosophy and feminist and critical race scholars yasmin gunaratnam shows how the care of vulnerable strangers tests the substance of a community from a radical new interpretation of the history of the contemporary hospice movement and its total pain approach to the charting of the global care chain and the affective and sensual demands of intercultural care gunaratnam offers a unique perspective on how migration endows and replenishes national cultures and care far from being a marginal concern death and the migrant shows that transnational dying is very much a predicament of our time raising questions and concerns that are relevant to all of us

the shopping mall seems an unlikely place to go for health care services yet the mall has become home to such services as well as a model for redesigning other health care facilities in medicine moves to the mall david charles sloane and beverlie conant sloane document the historical changes to our health care landscape by exploring the interactions between medicine and place this unique combination of architectural history and the history of medicine provides a thought provoking analysis of the geography of the practice of medicine the book presents three essays each accompanied by a gallery of historical and recent photos the authors discuss the rise of modern hospitals and how they were shaped into scientifically sterile and humanly stark medical workshops starting in the 1970s hospital facilities were altered in appearance to become more friendly and welcoming the integration of a shopping mall's spaciousness and open design with technology and scientific innovation served in humanizing the hospital most recently the accessibility and convenience of shopping center and roadside clinics have invited americans to go shopping for health in the increasingly commercialized medical system medicine moves to the mall will appeal to scholars and professionals in fields ranging from health care to cultural geography and from urban studies to architectural history as well as to readers interested in the shifting status of medicine in american society

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
