this book was originally published in 1970 in sociology in its place the essay which gives the volume its title mr runiman argues that sociology cannot usefully be distinguished in content from either anthropology or history that it is not only an historical but an applied science in the sense that its explanations are parasitic on the laws of others and that to talk to looking for distinctive sociological theories is therefore misconceived the papers in the volume are grouped under three headings the first four are methodological the second three contain some results of empirical research and the last four are philosophical the collection as a whole lends support to some of the important arguments of the opening essay

ferdinand de saussure's *Cours de linguistique générale* was posthumously composed by his students from the notes they had made at his lectures. The book became one of the most influential works of the twentieth century, giving direction to modern linguistics and inspiration to literary and cultural theory. Before he died, saussure told friends he was writing up the lectures himself, but no evidence of this was found. Eighty years later, in 1996, a manuscript in saussure's hand was discovered in the orangerie of his family house in Geneva. This proved to be the missing original of the great work. It is published now in English for the first time in an edition edited by Simon Bouquet and Rudolf Engler and translated and introduced by Carol Sanders and Matthew Pires. All leading saussure scholars, the book includes an earlier discovered manuscript on the philosophy of language, saussure's own notes for lectures, and a comprehensive bibliography of major work on saussure from 1970 to 2004. It is remarkable that for eighty years the understanding of saussure's thought has depended on an incomplete and non-definitive text, the sometimes aphoristic formulations of which gave rise to many creative interpretations and arguments. For and against saussure: did he or did he not see language as a social and a historical? Did he or did he not rule out the study of speech within linguistics? Was he a reductionist? These disputes and many others can now be resolved on basis of the work now published. This reveals new depth and subtlety in saussure's thoughts on the nature and complex workings of language, particularly his famous binary oppositions between form and meaning, the sign and what is signified, and language (*langue*) and its performance (*parole*).

this radical appraisal of durkheim's method, first published in 1988, argues that fundamental errors have been made in interpreting durkheim. Mike Gane argues that to understand the rules, it is necessary also to understand the context of the French society in which the book was written. He explores the cultural and philosophical debates which raged in France during the period when durkheim prepared the book and establishes the real and unsuspected complexity of durkheim's position, its formal complexity, its epistemological complexity, and its historical complexity.
