one of the main theses of the marienthal study was that prolonged unemployment leads to a state of apathy in which the victims do not utilize any longer even the few opportunities left to them the vicious cycle between reduced opportunities and reduced level of aspiration has remained the focus of all subsequent discussions so begin the opening remarks to the english language edition of what has become a major classic in the literature of social stratification

during the three decades from 1945 to 1975 the catholic church in west germany employed a broad range of methods from empirical social research statistics opinion polling and organizational sociology as well as psychoanalysis and other approaches from the psy sciences were debated and introduced in pastoral care in

adopting these methods for their own work bishops parish clergy and pastoral sociologists tried to open the church up to modernity in a rapidly changing society in the process they contributed to the reform agenda of the second vatican council 1962 1965 through its analysis of the intersections between organized religion and applied social sciences this award winning book offers fascinating insights into the trajectory of the catholic church in postwar germany

in social structure charles crothers argues the importance of social structure to analysis within the discipline of sociology the book provides a thorough introduction to the idea of social structure and lays out the issues which arise in its analysis

this book is based on the understanding that the diversity and heterogeneity of science and society are not only issue of critique but engender experimental forms of collaboration building on john dewey s experimental theory of knowledge and inquiry practice theory science and technology studies and the anthropology of nature the book offers a trenchant redefinition of a present focused sociology as a science of experience in the spirit of experimentalism crisis instead of being a mere problem is understood as the baseline for creativity and innovation committed to the experimental pursuit the book provides an experience based methodological approach for an inter and trans disciplinary sociology finally it argues for a globalized and transformative sociological outreach beyond established epistemic and national borders this book is of interest to sociologists and other social scientists pursuing experimentalism in theory method and or practice

this crossdisciplinary collection of essays combines qualitative and quantitative approaches to re examine the most influential contemporary theories of intercultural relations and their application in various domains including historiography sociology and cultural studies a particular focus lies on central europe historical banat and transylvania but also on the current public policies toward ethnic and religious minorities as well as recent immigrants it argues that much more complex approaches are needed both historically and conceptually in exploring intercultural relations thus the political decision making in east central european countries and the european union as a whole could benefit from a well informed historical perspective by learning from the successes and errors of their predecessors

the geographers bio bibliographical series volume 28 includes essays on dick chorley the influential geomorphologist charles p daly long serving president of the american geographical society marion newbigin one of the leading women geographers of the early twentieth century and peter heyley early modern humanist historian and geographical author

in the years preceding publication of this book in 1986 much progress was made in identifying the social sources of support for hitler s nsdap and in determining the tactics employed by the party to mobilise its constituency at grass roots level it has emerged that the nazi s roots were far more diverse than previously

assumed extending beyond the lower middle class to encompass both the affluent bourgeoisie and the working class this book collects together original studies which represent a distillation of some of the contemporaneous research

in the face of high unemployment in europe for the past thirty years the unemployed have organized themselves and mobilized at levels ranging from the local to the transnational this work explores why when and how the unemployed move from acquiescence to protest

the background for the international research conference health hazards and challenges in the new working life was the emerging questions concerning the health and social effects of the rapid changes in the labour market leading to increasing long term unemployment temporary employment and irregular employment contracts we knew that other countries have had this development at the labour market for a much longer time than sweden has and it seemed a good idea to invite interested researchers and practitioners to an international seminar to share the relevant research findings and discuss future research needs thus the first international interdisciplinary research conference on health hazards and challenges in the new working life was arranged in stockholm during the last year of the 2nd millennium but was directed towards the foreseen development during the next millennium we were very pleased that more than 200 participants came to a cold and dark country just after new year s eve and that it was a truly multidisciplinary setting it became very obvious that it is necessary for the occupational health and safety research community to reach out to the public health research community as well as to the social and political sciences in order to understand the determinants and to perform comprehensive analyses at several levels in this new labour market situation

the science of the commons proposes a new mode of comprehending communication leaving aside a sociological and linguistic model that defines communication as a process of information transmission this book introduces an innovative ethical political understanding of communication as a connection of the common the cohesive tie of the community muniz sodré critiques the weak ethical and political aspirations of the field of communication and suggests the construction of a post disciplinary science set against the classic disciplines of sociology anthropology and economics which resists a global ideology of financialization moving the field of communication beyond media studies to a philosophical reflection on the roots of the community the science of the commons is a ground breaking book that offers fresh perspectives for the study of communication worldwide
