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individual development and social change explanatory analysis represents a convergence of three lines of emphasis now visible in developmental research and theory building the three are 1 the life course as a focus for the study of development and social change and their interrelationships 2 the life span orientation to the study of individual development with its acknowledgment of the salience of contextual features for understanding development and 3 the growth of methodological innovations that provide more appropriate and powerful ways of exploiting data gathered to describe and explain developmental change processes the book opens with a study on how major cultural change originates and unfolds over time this is followed by separate chapters on the use of sequential designs for explanatory analyses evolutionary aspects of social and individual development the concepts of the theory of causal and weak causal regressive dependence and the concepts of age period and cohort from the perspective of developmental psychology subsequent chapters examine development and aging as lifelong processes of historical populations the methodological integration of natural and cultural science perspectives in developmental psychology and application of the multifaceted methodology to the mutuality of constraint between sociocultural group and individual dynamics

understanding developmental processes in the individual as well as in aggregates of individuals is an important aim of many of the social and behavioral sciences this book presents a theoretical framework for this endeavor an architecture for the study of human development across different disciplines this architecture describes two major sources of human development biology and culture and posits three central developmental mechanisms selection optimization and compensation

this book aimed at advanced undergraduates and postgraduate students in psychology and related areas provides a guide to the key theories and methods used by researchers carefully chosen articles are accompanied by a commentary from the author that helps students to understand the rationale for a study the choice of design and assessment measures use of statistics and the interpretation of results a wide range of recent research papers is included to cover observational and experimental methods from infancy to adolescence

this is the first of a two volume work in the annals series devoted to developmental psychology the project was originally conceived in 1985 when paul van geert who had just completed his theory building in developmental psychology north holland 1986 agreed to collaborate on anannals volume examining foundational issues pertaining to the concept of development the project attracted considerable interest and in view of the length of the resulting manuscript a decision was made to publish it in two volumes fortunately the contributors provided coherent perspectives on two relatively distinct developmental themes which served to

facilitate our task of dividing their contributions into two volumes the first volume deals with the foundations of developmental theory and methodology the second volume to appear as volume 8 of the annals with theoretical issues in developmental psychology in this first volume the contributions by willis overton and joachim wohlwill were completed in 1988 those by roger dixon richard lerner and david hultsch and paul van geert in 1989 commentaries followed quickly and replies to commentaries were completed in 1990 paul van geert provides a general framework within which the foundational issues of development are discussed he is especially concerned with the nature of transition models and the structure of time in developmental theory the relationship between methods and framework or theory is the topic of joachim wohlwill s contribution
