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volume i of the cambridge economic history of europe is a survey of agrarian life in roman and byzantine europe

an economic history of europe provides students with a comprehensive introduction to european economic history from the fifteenth century to the present day individual chapters offer brief references to previous historical periods and events with special attention given to core themes concerning economic development and an analysis of their change through time and space core themes examined in each period include the increasing prominence of industry international trade demand and supply dynamics agriculture the unique structure of this text enables students not only to gain a firm grounding in the long term evolution of the european economy but also provides an historical overview of the economic development of individual countries individual contributors analyze the shift from the modern to the contemporary period and offer a broad explanation of the historical roots of the problems that face today s economic development this key text is indispensable reading for students in economics economic history development economics and history

In this the first comprehensive survey of the economies of classical antiquity twenty eight chapters summarise the current state of scholarship in their specialised fields and sketch new directions for research they reflect a new interest in economic growth in antiquity and develop new methods for measuring economic development often combining textual and archaeological data that have previously been treated separately

Agrarian change and crisis in Europe 1200 1500 addresses one of the classic subjects on economic history the process of aggregate economic growth and the crisis that engulfed the European continent during the late middle ages this was not an ordinary crisis during the period 1200 1500 Europe witnessed endemic episodes of famine and a wave of plague epidemics that amounted to one of its worst health crises rivaled only by the Justinian plague in the sixth century these challenges called into question the production of goods and services and the distribution of wealth opening the possibility of fundamental systemic change this book offers an empirical synthesis on a host of economic demographic and technological developments which characterized the period 1200 1500 it covers virtually the entire continent and places equal emphasis both on providing a solid factual framework and comparing and contrasting various theoretical interpretations the broad geographical and conceptual scope of the book renders it indispensable not only for undergraduate students who take courses relating to the economic and social life of the middle ages but also to more advanced scholars who often specialize in only one country or region

This book deals with the question of how the religious orders and congregations rebuilt their patrimony a necessary prerequisite for the growth of the number of religious educational and charitable services

Originally published in 1985 Frederic C Lane and Reinhold C Mueller in the first volume of Money and Banking in Medieval and Renaissance Venice discuss Venice's economic achievement in terms of the complex system the city's inhabitants developed to manage money's of account and coins money merchants of Venice developed a system whereby a premium attached to money's of account acted as a stabilizing force and allowed merchants to engage in long term trade this system according to the authors helped establish Venice as a dominant city state in international trade and exchange this book outlines the development and success of this system through 1508 at the time it was first published this book made a significant contribution to the history of money and economics by underscoring the large role that Venice played in the economic history of the West and the ascendance

of capitalism as a structuring force of society

this volume takes up bankruptcy in early modern europe when its frequency made it not only an economic problem but a personal tragedy and a social evil using legal business and personal records the essays in this volume examine the impact of failure on business organizations and practices capital formation and circulation economic institutions and ethics and human networks and relations in the so called transition to modern society from the early sixteenth to the early nineteenth century one group of essays concentrates on the german speaking world and shows a common concern for the microeconomics of bankruptcy that is for such issues as the structure of the firm the nature of its capital and the practices of its partners especially their assessment of risk another group of essays shifts the focus from central to western and northern europe and away from the microeconomics of the early modern firm to an institutional consideration of bankruptcy the final group of essays turns to southern europe especially the mediterranean basin to assess bankruptcy not as an unfortunate result of crisis but as an intentional response to crisis all of the contributions are the result of original research many of the scholars publish in english for the first time all of the chapters are founded on close archival research offering insights not only into business organization and practice but also into social and cultural aspects of economic life from the late sixteenth to the early nineteenth century

this book offers an in depth exploration of the genesis of léon walras s work and its impact on the history of economics through a thorough examination of both published and unpublished writings correspondence and personal notes the book reveals new insights into walras s intellectual evolution and his overall conception of economics it traces the formation of his theoretical framework the elements of his political and social economy and his aspirations for a liberal and humanitarian scientific socialism the book is organized into five parts part i investigates the influences shaping walras s thought including his relationship with his father auguste walras and the intellectual legacy of jean baptiste say this section also discusses walras s views on the stages of historical development reflecting on the industrial and commercial transformations of his time and his framework for categorizing the social and political sciences part ii examines the development of walras s general equilibrium theory the role of free competition within a pure economy and the reception of his ideas in italy and france it highlights the historical and intellectual context surrounding his theoretical innovations part iii addresses walras s approach to the teaching of economics with a focus on avoiding intellectual rigidity particularly in france it explores his work in social and applied economics at lausanne and his efforts to shape academic resources such as library acquisitions to support this vision part iv critiques french liberalism analyzing walras s responses to figures like louis blanc and the saint simonians and discusses his editorial work with le travail

which advocated cooperative approaches part v highlights walras s reformist ideas including his vision for labor market organization the state s role in land repurchase to replace taxes the regulation of public services and natural monopolies and his ideas on democracy particularly his campaign for professional representation of interests this comprehensive analysis appeals to scholars and students of the history of economic thought and anyone interested in understanding the formation and legacy of walras s work

a collection of essays by leading historians of early modern europe and the u s this books explores how merchants entrepreneurs and other early modern capitalists viewed themselves

melding evolutionary theory and both animal and human ethology together with close descriptive historical research on a typical tuscan village in the seventeenth century hanlon explains the good reasons individuals had for behaving in ways that now seem strange to us

this is the second volume of conference proceedings for the handbook of the economic history of the alpine region in the preindustrial era which finally provides an extensive cross regional synopsis of the history of the alpine economy like braudel s classic on the mediterranean region renowned scholars examine the region and its people the everyday lives of alpine inhabitants and commerce migration and communication in three volumes

this book examines the development of social support systems in the modern age in the rural areas of the city states of northern italy this investigation achieves two main purposes first it allows researchers to understand the role occupied concretely by welfare and micro credit activities in the political and socio economic panorama of rural northern italy secondly it verifies to what extent the formation of a more or less structured support system influenced the establishment of local identity and the rooting of individuals the book brings together perspectives from different fields of research ranging from economic and political history to the study of the history of ecclesiastical institutions as well as integrating recent research on the anthropological value of welfare actions and the use of multiple historical sources it considers how the retreat of the welfare activity of the state associated with a depopulation of the rural areas of the peninsula and a steady increase of poverty into social fringes that were

previously not affected by economic problems pushes us to investigate more carefully the dynamics that in the ancien régime gave shape to the support activities against indigence and poverty this book will be of interest to academics and students working in economic history and social history

the name dggtd deutsche gesellschaft für geschichte und theorie der biologie german society for the history and theory of biology reflects recent history as well as german tradition the society is a relatively late addition to a series of german societies of science and medicine that began with the deutsche gesellschaft für geschichte der medizin und der naturwissenschaften founded in 1910 by leipzig university s karl sudhoff 1853 1938 who wrote we want to establish a german society in order to gather german speaking historians together in our special disciplines so that they form the core of an international society yet sudhoff at this time of burgeoning academic internationalism was quite willing to accommodate the wishes of a number of founding members and drop the word german in the title of the society and have it merge with an international society the founding and naming of the society at that time derived from a specific set of historical circumstances and the same was true some 80 years later when in 1991 in the wake of german reunification the deutsche gesellschaft für geschichte und theorie der biologie was founded from the start the society has been committed to bringing studies in the history and philosophy of biology to a wide audience using for this purpose its jahrbuch für geschichte und theorie der biologie parallel to the jahrbuch the verhandlungen zur geschichte und theorie der biologie has become the by now traditional medium for the publication of papers delivered at the society s annual meetings in 2005 the jahrbuch was renamed annals of the history and philosophy of biology reflecting the society s internationalist aspirations in addressing comparative biology as a subject of historical and philosophical studies

ever since the 2007 8 global financial crisis and its aftermath hyman minsky s theory has never been more relevant throughout his career jan kregel has called attention to minsky s contributions to understanding the evolution of financial systems the development of financial fragility and instability and designing the financial structure necessary to support the capital development of the economy building on minsky kregel developed a framework to analyze how different financial structures develop financial fragility over time rather than characterizing financial systems as market based or bank based kregel argued that it is necessary to distinguish between the risks that are carried on the balance sheets of banks and other financial institutions this volume brought together by felipe c rezende highlights these major contributions from kregel through a collection of his influential papers from various journals and conferences kregel s approach provides a strong theoretical

background to understand the making and unfolding of the crisis and helps us to draw policy implications to improve financial stability and suggest an alternative financial structure for a market economy in this book his knowledge is consolidated and the ideas he puts forward offer a path for future developments in economics which will be of great interest to those studying and researching in the fields of economics and finance

the volume focuses on the importance and placement of alternative exchange practices in the 13th to 18th centuries specifically examining goods and services used as means of payment in barter or in kind transactions despite monetary theory emphasizing credit and real currency coins or paper money did not prevent in kind transactions barter isn't merely a result of a lack of money but rather an economic choice with diverse reasons meanings and consequences found in both rural and urban areas these alternative exchange methods go beyond mere stopgaps and impact all economic activities from production to consumption

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
