relevance of the predominant wage labor paradigm for africa and the global south on durban s
docks focuses on dock labor in early apartheid durban south africa s main port city and a crucial

node in the trade and communication networks of the indian ocean and the british empire although the labor of zulu migrant dock workers made global trade possible they lived their lives largely in isolation both socially and economically from these global networks using seventy seven oral histories and extensive archival research ralph callebert examines the working and living conditions of durban s dock workers and the livelihoods of their rural households these households relied on a combination of wage labor pilferage informal trade and the rural economy dock workers experiences were thus more intricate than a focus on wage labor alone could capture foregrounding such multifaceted livelihoods callebert considers the dynamics of gender within dock workers households as well as their complicated political identities including their economic nationalism and fervent anti indian sentiments on durban s docks thus offers a new approach to the study of labor on the subcontinent and globally questioning the relevance of the predominant wage labor paradigm for africa and for the global south ralph callebert teaches history at the university of toronto

from the perspective of the international scholarly community under north atlantic domination south africa might look like a peripheral place of knowledge production in recent years a plethora of voices calling for provincializing europe for deconstructing eurocentrism and for adopting post and decolonial perspectives have challenged such views they have partly transformed the academic landscape but have had limited success in challenging the fundamental global divides in production circulation and recognition of social scientific knowledge this book chooses a different take on the question of how north atlantic domination could be challenged by conceptualizing counter hegemonic currents in international sociology instead of providing theoretical and deconstructive critiques counter hegemonic currents are effective through collective social scientific practice the production of data knowledge and texts of new generations of scholars the interaction with extra university actors leading to the gradual emergence of integrated and productive scientific communities their orientation towards local arenas of discussion and production of socially relevant research effectively reduces the belief in the hegemony of the north the historical development of south african labour studies is a case in point this study provides a systematic in depth analysis of research and teaching activities networks with extra academic actors and international cooperation over time in the three major labour studies centres johannesburg durban and cape town it draws on a rich variety of material including annual reports of research centres and labour service organizations teaching contents and exam questions the 1974 2003 volumes of the south african labour bulletin and newsletters of isa research committee 44 on labour movements qualitative analysis of four seminal books is used to assess their contribution to original general theory building in depth interviews with labour studies representatives complement the analysis of documents and literature by reconstructing the oral history of this scholarly community an indispensable source given that many debates could not appear in written form or had to be watered during the apartheid years the study concludes that over time south african social scientists have generated knowledge on labour industry and trade unions that is universally comprehensible but arrogantly local

despite the port's prominence in maritime history its cultural significance has long been neglected in favour of its role within economic and imperial networks defined by their intersection of maritime and urban space port towns were sites of complex cultural exchanges this book the product of international scholarship offers innovative and challenging perspectives on the cultural histories of ports ranging from eighteenth century africa to twentieth century australasia and europe the essays in this important collection explore two key themes the nature and character of sailortown culture and port town life and the representations of port towns that were forged both within and beyond urban maritime communities the book's exploration of port town identities and cultures and its use of a rich array of methodological approaches and cultural artefacts will make it of great interest to both urban and maritime historians it also represents a major contribution to the emerging interdisciplinary field of coastal studies

the young black activists whose rejection of their parents complacency led to the 1976 soweto uprising and the eventual demise of apartheid are part of a long tradition of generational conflict in south africa in *Blood from Your Children* benedict carton traces this intense challenge to an extraordinary and pivotal episode a century ago that bitterly divided families along generational lines facing a series of ecological disasters that crippled agriculture in the 1890s african youths in colonial natal and zululand perceived their fathers struggle to meet increased colonial demands as an act of betrayal young people engaged more frequently in premarital sex while young men sparked widespread gang fights and young women rejected traditional filial and marital obligations in 1906 after the imposition of an onerous head tax on young men this domestic turmoil exploded into an armed uprising known as bambatha's rebellion the young men sought revenge by attacking both the african patriarchs whose apparent accommodation they considered traitorous and the colonial troops dispatched to quell the violence after the natal forces crushed the insurrection some captured rebels faced trial for treason under martial law often their fathers testified against them while the military intervention eventually caused many more african youths to seek work in the mines thus defusing generational turmoil others moved to industrial centers in the wake of the uprising these young people formed the vanguard of insurgent political groups that continue to play an important role in south african urban life through his lively and thorough presentation of the forces at work in bambatha's rebellion benedict carton brings a fresh understanding to the tragic role of defiant youth and generational rivalry in african resistance

the post millennium world has been experiencing several recognisable historical milestones with regard to arts culture and heritage one of these has been the resuscitation and revival of creative elements of the arts culture and heritage of previously marginalised or disadvantaged communities around the world until recently there had been scant regard and skewed allocation of resources for these but lately attempts have been made to promote and sustain them in order to enable the socio economic aspirations of a multicultural society the contributions brought together here are the product of papers that were presented during a conference on strategic repositioning of arts culture and heritage in the 21st century they cover a broad spectrum of subjects such as indigeneity music song and identity politics national reconciliation education product development and national development
