a sex coach based in the uk jem describes how she miraculously healed her body of lung cancer using the power of tantra the final section of the book outlines four tantric meditation techniques that can be used in everyday life for empowerment and healing throughout the book there are beautiful images of philosophers various meditation techniques and a variety of tantric symbols such as the biblical interpretations of the seed of life the flower of life and the three dimensional kali yantra it aims to offer a subjective existential meaning to enhance the depth of it s reader s life while using this book as a guide for your tantric expedition always remember if you know that you don t have to seek if you don t know that then you don t know what to seek if you think you know that then you actually don t know that isavasya upanishad

esoteric practice and initiation the third section the book explores misunderstood and concealed dimensions of tantra including the guru shishya parampara panchamakara maithuna and the role of secrecy and symbolic language the final section integration and application outlines rituals like panchapuja navavarana puja and sri chakra yantra meditation while also considering the role of manifestation in tantra and exploring what it has in common with quantum physics whether you are a beginner a seasoned sadhaka or just an observer of eastern traditions this book offers an integrative introduction into the living tradition of tantra

in previous studies of south asian tantric ritual scholars tend to focus on one region or context for the first time tantra ritual performance and politics in nepal and kerala embodying the goddess clan offers a comparative approach to tantric mediumship as observed in two locales navadurg rituals in bhaktapur nepal and teyy am in north kerala in this book matthew martin advances a new theory of ritual which spotlights the way dancer mediums embody medieval goddess clans and ancestor deities through offerings of food and sacrifice that synchronize their denizens with the land in spiralling web like ritual networks uniquely interdisciplinary in style this study synthesizes cultural history ethnography and theory to explore the continuities historical societal and political that characterize these ritual traditions across the subcontinent

contemporary debates on mansplaining foreground the authority enjoyed by male speech and highlight the way it projects listening as the responsibility of the dominated and speech as the privilege of the dominant what mansplaining denies systematically is the right of women to speak and be heard as much as men this book excavates numerous instances of the authority of female speech from indian goddess traditions and relates them to the contemporary gender debates especially to the issues of mansplaining and womansplaining these traditions present a paradigm of female speech that compels its male audience to reframe the configurations of masculinity this tradition of authoritative female speech forms a continuum even though there are many points of disjuncture as well as conjuncture between the vedic upanishadic puranic and tantric figurations of the goddess as an authoritative speaker the book underlines the goddess s role as the spiritual mentor of her devotee exemplified in the devi gitas and re situates the female gurus in hinduism within the traditions that find in devi s speech ultimate spiritual authority moreover it explores whether the figure of devi as womansplainer can encourage a more dialogic structure of gender relations in today s world where female voices are still often undervalued

tantric traditions in both buddhism and hinduism are thriving throughout asia and in asian diasporic communities around the world yet they have been largely ignored by western scholars until now this collection of original essays fills this gap by examining the ways in which tantric buddhist traditions have changed over time and distance as they have spread across cultural boundaries in asia the book is divided into three sections dedicated to south asia central asia and east asia the essays cover such topics as the changing ideal of masculinity in buddhist literature the controversy triggered by the transmission of the indian buddhist deity heruka to tibet in the 10th century and the evolution of a chinese buddhist

this book matters now in an age of spiritual cherry picking and viral tantra workshops the original vows ethics and cosmologies are often stripped away leaving methods unmoored from their protective context this book restores that context without gatekeeping without sensationalism and invites you to engage with these traditions as living lineages not lifestyle accessories you will not find empty romanticism here you will find the grammar of sacred union breath attention imagery ethics the universal principles that travel well and the initiatory thresholds that must remain intact if you are a practitioner seeking depth beyond your home tradition scholar of religion or esotericism curious reader who has sensed there s more to tantra and alchemy than meets the eye this book offers a map that is both wide in scope and precise in detail laing z matthews is an author and comparative scholar whose works bridge daoist buddhist sufi kabbalistic and hermetic traditions known for combining scholarly rigor with lived practice matthews also writes the art of the bedchamber series tantra of tibet karmamudr sacred eros and the cross cultural science of awakening and the esoteric traditions of the world seven volume series more at laingzmatthews com step into the meeting place of opposites this is your invitation to walk the ancient roads from india to iberia and discover the enduring power of union
