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this title originally published in 1988 examines the network of states and the political and economic systems which bound the british empire together this book examines each country and how the empire made its mark in the shape of urban form public buildings and rural land patterns an overall assessment of the imperial heritage is attempted as a pointer to the unity which existed between the many diverse lands for a brief period in their history

martin kitchen has written an informative account of the rise and fall of the british empire concentrating on the 19th and 20th centuries but giving the background of the first british empire which was lost with the creating of the usa

this edited work adopts a distinctive thematic approach to the history of british imperialism from the 18th to the 20th century each contributor offers a personal assessment of the topic at hand and examines key interpretive debates among historians

up to world war ii and beyond the british ruled over a vast empire modern western attitudes towards the imperial past tend either towards nostalgia for british power or revulsion at what seem to be the abuses of that power the cambridge illustrated history of the british empire adopts neither of these approaches it aims to create historical understanding about the british empire on the assumption that such understanding is important for any informed appreciation of the modern world through striking illustration and a text written by leading experts this book examines the experience of colonialism in north america india africa australia and the caribbean as well as the impact of the empire on britain itself emphasis is placed on social and

offers a comprehensive analysis not just of political events and territorial conquests but paints a picture of what life was like under colonial rule both for those who ruled and for those whose countries came under british authority there has been a lively debate in recent years about whether empires generally are good or bad things and the british empire has been very much at the centre of that debate with a number of voices arguing that it was a kinder gentler empire than its rivals this book speaks specifically to that debate and also to a second and equally vigorous debate about whether anyone in britain actually cared about the possession of an empire

for almost two hundred years britain dominated the world its naval supremacy enabling it to acquire a vast empire including india canada australia new zealand and much of africa although it could not prevent its american colonies from becoming independent its industrial and commercial power helped it to keep its scattered possessions under control while a small army was sufficient to put down native rebellions in the absence of the involvement of oher euroean states a dwindling economy and the cost of two world wars saw this once mighty empire crumble giving in the process independence to nearly all of its dominions in the years after 1945 empire is a succinct and highly readable account of this extraordinary rise and fall
