first published in 1994 this volume includes an examination the regional dynamics of namibia s decolonization since early 1985 and the author s interest in southwestern africa since he witnessed the south african invasion of angola in 1975 76 as a delegate of the international committee of the red cross the research was undertaken as part of a post doctoral project supported by the swiss national science foundation it also includes extensive research in the region notably in the frontline states

this title was first published in 2001 grand aims refers to the overarching tenets and doctrines that prevailed in us and south african foreign policies towards africa this

study argues that when modest means were imposed upon american and south african foreign policy makers they were often forced to devise new grand aims few in depth resources exist with regard to united states and or south african foreign policies towards africa those that do are overwhelmingly pre or early 1990s in focus this analysis encompasses the years 1990 to mid 1998 and is intended to be relevant to a broad readership including academics students africanists historians political scientists regional specialists and policy makers in the public and private sectors on both sides of the atlantic

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home front south africa and the second world war offers a fresh academic perspective through the voices of both new and established scholars leveraging recently uncovered archival material to illuminate the experiences of south africans at home between 1939 and 1945 this latest addition to south africa s wartime historiography is thoughtfully divided into two broad sections dealing with active participation in and resistance against the allied war effort the book highlights the vigorous mobilisation and recruitment campaigns that saw thousands enlist and the pivotal roles women assumed in industry and civil service it explores how the war effort permeated every facet of society challenging traditional gender roles and societal norms it delves into the dynamic shifts within south african society from politics and community mobilisation to the contributions of collegiate schools and the impact on sports it uncovers the undercurrents of dissent that existed alongside visible support it brings to light the political activism within the african national congress the covert operations of nazi sympathisers and the simmering tensions among afrikaner nationalists in doing so the chapters collectively unravel the complexity of south african society where loyalty and opposition coexisted often influenced by propaganda espionage and socio political manoeuvring

this book explores the challenge of dismantling colonial schooling and how entangled power relations of the past have lingered in post apartheid south africa it examines the on the ground history of colonialism from the vantage point of a small town in the karoo region showing how patterns of possession and dispossession have played out in the municipality and schools using the strong political and ontological critique of decoloniality theories the book demonstrates the ways in which government interventions over many years have allowed colonial relations and the construction of racialised differences to linger in new forms including unequal access to schooling written in an accessible style the book considers how the dream of decolonial schooling might be realised from the vantage point of research on the margins this karoo region also offers an interesting case study as the site where the world's largest radio telescope was recently located and highlights the contrasting logics of international big science and local development needs this book will be of interest to academics and scholars in the education field as well as to social geographers sociologists human geographers historians and policy makers chapters 1 and 10 of this book are freely available as downloadable open access pdfs at taylorfrancis.com under a creative commons attribution non commercial no derivatives cc by nc nd 4.0 license

this study deals with a particular kind of short story in south african english literature a kind of story variously called the fireside tale tall tale skaz narrative or the term used here the oral style story most famously exemplified in the oom schalk lourens narratives of herman charles bosman the oral style story has its roots in the hunting tale and camp fire yarn of the nineteenth century and has dozens of exponents in south african literature most of them long forgotten here this neglect has been addressed a w drayson s tales at the outspan 1862 provides a point of departure and is followed by discussions of works by william charles scully percy fitzpatrick ernest glanville perceval gibbon francis carey slater pauline smith and aegidius jean blignaut all of whom used the oral style story genre in the work of herman charles bosman however the south african oral style story comes into its own in his oom schalk lourens figure is invested all of the complexity and double voicedness that was latent and largely dormant in the earlier works bosman demonstrates his sophistication particularly in his metafictional use of the oral style story the study concludes with a discussion of the use of oral forms in the work of more recent black writers among them bessie head mtutuzeli matshoba and njabulo ndebele

rights and responsibilities in rural south africa examines the gendered and generational conflicts surrounding social change in south africa s rural eastern cape roughly twenty years after the end of apartheid in post apartheid south africa rights based public discourse and state practices promote liberal autonomous and egalitarian notions of personhood yet widespread unemployment and poverty demand that people rely closely on one another and forge relationships that disrupt the gendered and generational hierarchies framed as traditional and culturally authentic kathleen rice examines the ways these tensions and restructurings lead to uncertainties about how south africans should live together in their daily lives with particular implications for understanding and responding to widespread gendered and sexual conflict and violence focusing particularly on the women of the village of mhlambini rights and responsibilities in rural south africa offers compelling portraits of how they experience and navigate widespread social and economic change and presents their experiences

as a way of understanding how people navigate the moral ambiguities of contemporary south african life

in south africa and the logic of regional cooperation james j hentz addresses changes in south africa s strategies for regional cooperation and economic development since its transition from apartheid to democracy hentz focuses on why the new south african government continues to make regional cooperation a priority and what methods this dominant state uses to pursue its neighborly goals while providing a synthetic overview of the history of regional cooperation in southern africa hentz considers the logic of cooperation more generally an extensive discussion of south african politics provides the context for hentz s exploration of the more widely felt effects of domestic change readers interested in the international organization of the politics and economy of southern africa will find thought provoking material in this important book
