community that attempts to live faithfully to the story of god by learning to be faithful disciples we are more able to see the world as it is stanley hauerwas the peaceable kingdom ethics provide the cultural and moral framework in which we live our whole lives our ethics are like the air we breathe and though for the most part they go unnoticed our lives and communities depend on them but christian ethics are distinctive they are not just anyone's ethics indeed if the christian vision is not distinct from other moral frameworks then what is so special about christ and our story for many jesus has simply become nothing more than a personal and private motivator to the same common ideals which are shared by all so how do we live distinctively in a time of uncertainty how do we see the world through the eyes of christ what tools do we need for the complex choices that confront us in order to live well to live christ centred lives in the 21st century this book provides this kind of help in a clearly written accessible style with discussion questions making this useful for small group use

the erosion of moral values on a global scale has left nations vulnerable to greed power and violence as the shaping forces of culture in the absence of an ethical foundation corruption reverberates through public life destabilizing countries and undermining human flourishing examining the many challenges facing nigeria in the twenty first century dr sunday bobai agang suggests that his homeland is experiencing just such a crisis one rooted not in religion economics or politics but rather an eroding moral foundation for a nation to thrive he argues its people must possess a moral and ethical vision characterized by sincerity and truth love and unity far from representing impractical ideals these are the virtues upon which a nation's security and stability depend endangered moral values offers both a powerful warning of the dangers inherent in ignoring a society's ethical and moral decay and a passionate invitation for citizens to work together towards a transformed future

in african women and the shame and pain of infertility an ethico cultural study of christian response to childlessness among the

igbo people of west africa okoro discusses the shipwreck that is associated with infertility in marriage in africa within this space childlessness places a big question mark on a woman s femininity and the self esteem of the man the stigma of infertility most often leads to social isolation and humiliation particularly of married women even when the source of infertility may not have come from them unfortunately this situation goes against the highly valued igbo ethical principle of *onye aghala nwanne ya* meaning no kith or kin should be left behind therefore the purpose of the book is to help married people in igbo land and africa at large to appropriate this indigenous principle in their response to the problem of infertility to attain this the author critically evaluates discrimination and oppression of infertile couples particularly women and shedding light on the paradoxes found in igbo cultural expressions he employs a constructive ethical cultural religious contextual and theological approach that explores important igbo religious paradigms like *chi* an igbo religio cultural understanding of personal destiny and *ani* the feminine deity in charge of the land and fertility to argue the case for the liberation and integration of infertile couples

this volume was first published by inter disciplinary press in 2013 chronicity is about people rather than medical conditions it may best be understood as a complex phenomenon in which multiple elements interact with each other in unpredictable ways to bring about unanticipated changes making sense of chronicity therefore requires that we not only pay attention to all aspects of experiencing the condition but also think about the relationships between them

although asserting one s ethnic identity is not morally wrong the manner in which one ethnic group construes or relates to the ethnic other s can obliterate the bond of togetherness and create the insecurity of life ethiopia which is home to anthropologically diverse ethno linguistic groups exhibits a proclivity to ethnic based hostilities and conflicts as a result of such hostilities ethiopia had suffered recurrent small and large scale deaths and in the last half decade only millions have been

internally displaced and live in dire conditions in dialogue with perspectives from a wide range of disciplines such as history law sociology philosophy theology and political thought this multi authored book aims at generating christian moral resources for peaceful multiethnic togetherness this interdisciplinary engagement is meant to buttress the task of interpreting ethnic diversity and national unity within both contemporary and historical ethiopia and articulating a christian moral response to the crisis of togetherness ensuing from the malpractices of affirming ethnic identity and enacting national unity

divided into four major sections this textbook provides an in depth exploration of the biblical philosophical cultural and practical concerns facing african christians as they proclaim and defend the gospel in africa written by a diverse group of pastors and scholars it provides a much needed interdisciplinary and contextualized approach to apologetics it also seeks to bridge the gap between academic research and ministry practice touching on such topics as hermeneutics biblical criticism church history the nature of evil religious inclusivism muslim christian engagement eldership rites domestic violence cults and the digital age biblically robust contextually relevant ministry oriented and accessible this is a remarkable resource for enriching the life and ministry of christians in africa and beyond
