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in the blue ridge mountains along the virginia north carolina border an extraordinarily rich musical heritage survives and flourishes even before the legendary bill monroe coined the term bluegrass in the mid 1950s the traditional music of this area was coming into its own as a distinctive style early performers from the 1920s through the 1950s many of whom migrated northward during the great depression popularized the music they had grown up hearing thereby preserving and celebrating the cultural legacy of their home region in a hot bed of musicians paula anderson green tells the stories of several of these legendary performers and instrument makers from the upper new river valley whitetop mountain region including ola belle campbell reed albert hash and dave sturgill these men and women began to bring the music of appalachia to a wider audience well before nashville became the center of country music making extensive use of interviews the book reveals the fascinating experiences and enduring values behind the practice of old time music this musical heritage remains an indispensable component of appalachian culture and anderson green traces the traditions down to the present generation of

musicians there written for anyone with an interest in mountain music this book focuses on performers from alleghany and ashe counties in north carolina and carroll county and grayson county in virginia it includes a comprehensive appendix of place names and music venues as well as annotated lists of musicians and the songs they have performed the author paula hathaway anderson green is an adjunct professor of english at kennesaw state university and does research in appalachian studies

a complete guide to the world of the five string banjo written for both beginners and more experienced players packed with over 120 how to photos and 130 musical examples 94 track cd included hear and play along with every exercise and song the only book to offer instruction in clawhammer bluegrass melodic single string minstrel and classic styles from earl scruggs driving bluegrass picking to the genre busting jazz fusion of blla fleck and the multi million selling movie soundtrack o brother where are thou the five string banjo can be heard just about everywhere in american music these days banjo for dummies is the most complete guide to the five string banjo ever written it covers everything you need to get into the banjo including how to choose tune and care for your instrument developing a good playing posture fretting your first chords and getting comfortable with the left and right hand picking patterns used for clawhammer and bluegrass playing techniques you ll then add the left hand spicing up your playing with slides hammer ons pull offs and chokes for an authentic five string banjo sound from there you ll move on the play 19th century minstrel style early 20th century classic style as well as try your hand at more advanced examples of bluegrass style an in depth chapter on bluegrass music explores scruggs licks and techniques as well as melodic and single string styles with song examples also included is a banjo buyer s guide a section on music theory as applied to bluegrass and old time music an accessories guide advice on cases picks straps metronomes computer aids and much more information on how to find a good teacher banjo camp or festival chord charts bios of twelve influential players practice tips and much much more banjo for dummies is accessible and fun to read and it s easy to locate just what you re interested in playing included are 20 songs including several new compositions written by the author just for this book including reno rag single string style winston s jig irish three finger and everyday breakdown scruggs style all musical examples are played slowly on the accompanying cd many with guitar and mandolin accompaniment bill evans is one of the world s most celebrated banjo players and teachers he has taught thousands of people to play the five string banjo in private lessons and group workshops literally all over the world in addition to leading the bill evans string summit bill has performed with dry branch fire squad david grisman peter rowan tony trischka and many others and he hosts his own acclaimed banjo camp the nashcamp fall banjo retreat in the nashville area as an american music historian he has taught at san francisco state university the university virginia and duke university he has written a popular instructional column for banjo newsletter magazine for the last fifteen years and hosts three popular instructional dvds for acutab publications to learn more about bill visit his homepage at nativeandfine com note cd rom dvd and other supplementary materials are not included as part of the e book file but are available for download after purchase

many folk banjoists draw influence from greats such as pete seeger woody guthrie the weavers peter paul and mary and many others these folk musicians traveled the country singing the folk songs that many of us now know some of which are still played in jam sessions first lessons folk banjo is a great introduction to learning these types of folk songs on this wonderful instrument included are lessons on singing and playing backup with the banjo

strumming and picking exercises and many classic folk songs the music is written intablature and the book comes with accompanying audio available for download online

these two 2 hour videos supplement ken perlman s melodic clawhammer banjo the handbook on how to play this purely american style leads you step by step to a thorough understanding of the banjo teaching basic right hand and left hand positions simple chords and fundamental clawhammer techniques like the brush the bum titty strums pull offs slides and more progresses to more advanced techniques 4 hours

this book and two cd set is intended to be a tune repertoire book it includes over 100 old time festival favorites some are cliché others unusual some easy some difficult this mandolin book includes two lines of standard notation basic and advanced as well as a mandolin tab line that can be interpreted for fiddle also the basic version should be playable by those with general skills the advanced version will require more time and finesse as it is more ornamental often more than just melodic and may include less than intuitive ways of playing some passages download the free mandolin versions of the songs from this book download the free fiddle versions of songs from this book

you asked for it and you got it more tunes to play at festivals and jams or just sittin at home with a friend or two 62 more tunes with both basic and advanced standard notation lines with suggested chords as well as a mandolin tablature line to get you going in the right direction and playing these old time favorites as in old time festival tunes for fiddle and mandolin mb21023bcd you will find some of the tunes to be straightforward while others promise to be genuine finger twisters the book revisits some of the author s old favorites and some time tested standards includes access to online audio the accompanying audio includes each tune on both fiddle and mandolin with a separate cd for each instrument there is also a clawhammer banjo companion to this book titled old time favorites for clawhammer banjo mb30224bcd which shares the same basic standard notation line in this volume

this book and accompanying audio are an excellent introduction to the fiddle and old time music the lessons are designed to help the reader develop a solid foundation on the instrument the book employs a practical teaching style rather than traditional methods and conventions a brief history of the fiddle is presented first followed by a visual overview of the instrument basic technique and playing style twelve jam session tunes are included along with a commentary on jam session etiquette and an extensive discography of suggested recordings the audio includes slow and up to speed versions of all the exercises and tunes includes access to extensive online audio

the banjo is emblematic of american country music and it is at the core of other important musical movements including jazz and ragtime the instrument has been adopted by many cultures and has been ingrained into many musical traditions from mento music in the caribbean and dance music in ireland virtuosos such as billya fleck have played bach african music and christmas tunes on the five string banjo and the instrument has had a resurgence in pop music with such acts as mumford and sons and the avett brothers this book offers the first comprehensive illustrated history of the banjo in its many forms it

traces the story of the instrument from its roots in west africa to its birth in the americas through its coming of age in the industrial revolution and beyond the book profiles the most important players and spotlights key luthiers and manufacturers it features 100 milestone instruments with in depth coverage including model details and beautiful photos it offers historical context surrounding the banjo through the ages from its place in victorian parlors and speakeasies through its role in the folk boom of the 1950s and 1960s to its place in the hands of songwriter john hartford and comedian steve martin folk jazz bluegrass country and rock the banjo has played an important part in all of these genres lavishly illustrated and thoughtfully written by author broadcaster and acclaimed banjoist bob carlin this is a must have for lovers of fretted instruments aficionados of roots music and music history buffs

tommy thompson arrived in chapel hill north carolina in 1963 smitten by folk and traditional appalachian music in 1972 he teamed with bill hicks and jim watson to form the nontraditional string band the red clay ramblers mike craver joined in 1973 and jack herrick in 1976 over time musicians including clay buckner bland simpson and chris frank joined tommy who played with the band until 1994 drawing on interviews and correspondence and the personal papers of thompson the author depicts a life that revolved around music and creativity appendices cover thompson s banjos his discography and notes on his collaborative lyric writing

over 425 reels jigs set tunes waltzes marches strathspeys and airs transcribed from the playing of traditional fiddlers make this a must have title

north carolina musicians pioneered and mastered the genres of old time and bluegrass music the roots of american music are deeply grounded in north carolina s music history doc watson played mountain fiddle tunes on guitar he emerged as the father of flatpicking and forever changed the role of the guitar in american music charlie poole created techniques that eventually defined bluegrass and folks around the state heard his banjo on some of the most important old time recordings rising star rhiannon giddens keeps the music alive today through new interpretations of classic old time and bluegrass songs elizabeth carlson profiles these and other masters of string music in this fascinating record of north carolina s musical past present and future

this is a biography of dan levenson an old time banjo and fiddle player from pittsburgh pennsylvania between 1987 and 1991 dan worked for goose acres folk music center in cleveland ohio where he dove deeply into old time music in the late 1980s he formed the boiled buzzards they recorded four albums between 1989 and 1994 and were a consistently active presence at old time music festivals he also played with bob frank during that time as one half of the hotfoot duo in 1995 he teamed up with kim murley and recorded new frontier instrumentals from china and america levenson undertook his first cross country trip as a solo performer in 1996 his traveling workshop meet the banjo ran with the sponsorship of deering banjos from the late 1990s to the early 2000s dan recorded three projects in the first five years of the 2000s and began editing the quarterly old time way section for banjo newsletter in 2005 he continues performing old time music teaching fiddle and banjo writing instructional and repertoire books featuring banjo and fiddle tunes for mel bay and making plans for more old time music projects

dwight hamilton diller is a musician from west virginia devoted to traditional appalachian fiddle and banjo music and a seminary trained minister steeped in local christian traditions for the past 40 years he has worked to preserve archaic fiddle and banjo tunes teaching his percussive primitively rhythmic style to small groups in marathon banjo workshops this book tells of diller s life and music his personal challenges and his decades of teaching an elusive musical form

southern appalachian native dan levenson and mel bay publications present clawhammer banjo from scratch a guide for the claw less this book teaches clawhammer banjo the way we play not the way others say it really begins as though you really have no knowledge of how to play the five string banjo clawhammer style based on dan s innovative meet the banjo program where dan brings 15 banjos and teaches players who may have never held a banjo this book assumes no prior experience beginning at the beginning dan presents a brief history of the 5 string banjo then goes over the parts of the banjo holding the banjo right and left hand positions and his basic clawhammer strum even the strum is broken down into the steps of the finger and thumb you are guided through the chords the scale and then the individual notes of each of 12 jam session favorite tunes from scratch includes audio recordings available for download online with all exercises tunes slow and up to speed and a fiddle version of each tune

john wright s collection of interviews and stories about ralph stanley puts readers around a campfire at a bluegrass festival while old timers weave yarns far into the night told by those who create produce stage love and virtually live for old time mountain music these tales come from the longtime coworkers sidemen promoters friends and others in the orbit of the music legend the storytellers include a scholar who knew stanley from the early days the housewife who ran the stanley brothers fan club and a souvenir seller for whom the discovery of stanley s music was almost a religious experience wright also uses these invaluable oral histories as a foundation to describe and evaluate stanley s long career with the clinch mountain boys and the development of his music after the death of his brother carter an appendix covers ralph s prolific recording activity through the mid 1990s including a breathtaking forty five albums comprising more than 550 songs and tunes

ken perlman has been involved in expanding the range and flexibility of the clawhammer banjo style for several years and was one of the first to successfully arrange irish jigs and reels for five string banjo he plays some of these irish tunes on the kicking mule records anthology melodic clawhammer banjo

for the first time this groundbreaking songbook collaboration by music writer kristina r gaddy and grammy award winner rhiannon giddens makes nineteen examples of early black atlantic music accessible and playable for today s musicians music enthusiasts and historians presenting music from 1687 through the 1860s in modern treble clef and banjo tablature along with the rich stories behind each song gaddy and giddens take readers on a journey from the caribbean across the americas immensely readable for amateurs and professionals alike go back and fetch it explains the significance of early black atlantic music and how the patterns of tunings melodic lines and lyrics shed light on the impact that black american music has had on nineteenth century popular

music early country old time and bluegrass each tune pairs with an engaging essay on its historical background and how the tune transformed over time as well as information about the collector deeply researched and carefully approached this essential source restores the roots of black music to the musical canon

focus irish traditional music is an introduction to the instrumental and vocal traditions of the republic of ireland and northern ireland as well as irish music in the context of the irish diaspora ireland s size relative to britain or to the mainland of europe is small yet its impact on musical traditions beyond its shores has been significant from the performance of jigs and reels in pub sessions as far flung as japan and cape town to the worldwide phenomenon of riverdance focus irish traditional music interweaves dance film language history and other interdisciplinary features of ireland and its diaspora the accompanying cd presents both traditional and contemporary sounds of irish music at home and abroad

whether you already play old time music or you are just getting started this is the book for you dan levenson s master collection of old time tunes presents more than 300 tunes in standard notation with suggested chords for you to explore and enjoy all but a few are traditional or older tunes and are easily searched online to discover their pedigree as well as several recorded versions of them some might call this a complete repertoire in a book in the following sense it is a large though not encyclopedic collection of old time fiddle tunes played in today s sessions learning the tunes in this book will give you a solid old time repertoire that would allow you to join in jams in the many communities playing old time music today
