how can theory improve our knowledge of writing raúl sánchez answers this question by examining dominant theoretical trends in composition studies over the last fifteen years citing their common origins in a narrow representational metatheory of writing he argues that this adherence actually leads the field away from its objects of study writing and the writing subject through this extended critique he elaborates an alternative metatheory one that restores writing to the conceptual center of composition studies by emphasizing its generative rather than its representational characteristics particularly in increasingly networked and textualized cultures

the oxford handbook of music composition pedagogy presents an illuminating collection of philosophy research applied practice and international perspectives to highlight the practices of teaching and learning in the field of music composition the handbook offers various strategies and approaches in composition for teachers music teacher educators and students of music education

at the centre of the traditional discussion of truth is the question of how truth is defined recent research especially with the development of deflationist accounts of truth has tended to take truth as an undefined primitive notion governed by axioms while the liar paradox and cognate paradoxes pose problems for certain seemingly natural axioms for truth in this book volker halbach examines the most important axiomatizations of truth explores their properties and shows how the logical results impinge on the philosophical topics related to truth in particular he shows that the discussion on topics such as deflationism about truth depends on the solution of the paradoxes his book is an invaluable survey of the logical background to the philosophical discussion of truth and will be indispensable reading for any graduate or professional philosopher in theories of truth

in recent years there have been a number of books both anthologies and monographs that have focused on the liar paradox and more generally on the semantic paradoxes either offering proposed treatments to those paradoxes or critically evaluating ones that occupy logical space at the same time there are a number of people who do great work in philosophy who have various semantic logical metaphysical and or epistemological commitments that suggest that they should say something about the liar paradox yet who have said very little if anything about that paradox or about the extant projects involving it the purpose of this volume is to afford those philosophers the opportunity to address what might be described as reflections on the liar

his understanding of being and the categories his models of explanation and causation and his accounts of modality space and change no knowledge of ancient greek is assumed

the dictionary of modern american philosophers includes both academic and non academic philosophers and a large number of female and minority thinkers whose work has been neglected it includes those intellectuals involved in the development of psychology pedagogy sociology anthropology education theology political science and several other fields before these disciplines came to be considered distinct from philosophy in the late nineteenth century each entry contains a short biography of the writer an exposition and analysis of his or her doctrines and ideas a bibliography of writings and suggestions for further reading while all the major post civil war philosophers are present the most valuable feature of this dictionary is its coverage of a huge range of less well known writers including hundreds of presently obscure thinkers in many cases the dictionary of modern american philosophers offers the first scholarly treatment of the life and work of certain writers this book will be an indispensable reference work for scholars working on almost any aspect of modern american thought

a counter history of composition contests the foundational disciplinary assumption that vitalism and contemporary rhetoric represent opposing disconnected poles in the writing tradition vitalism has been historically linked to expressivism and concurrently dismissed as innate intuitive and unteachable whereas rhetoric is seen as a rational teachable method for producing argumentative texts counter to this byron hawk identifies vitalism as the ground for producing rhetorical texts the product of complex material relations rather than the product of chance through insightful historical analysis ranging from classical greek rhetoric to contemporary complexity theory hawk defines three forms of vitalism oppositional investigative and complex and argues for their application in the environments where students write and think today hawk proposes that complex vitalism will prove a useful tool in formulating post dialectical pedagogies most notably in the context of emerging digital media he relates two specific examples of applying complex vitalism in the classroom and calls for the reexamination and reinvention of current self limiting pedagogies to incorporate vitalism and complexity theory
