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today we can no longer hide under the pretence that the grace of god alone suffices to make one a good priest a close study of the history of priestly formation has shown that not just the training of priests can ensure an authentic priest product rather a continuous effort to adapt the training to the current world situation so that priests would be in the position to discharge their duties effectively such readiness to adaptability should of course not lose sight of the meaning and function

of the priest as revealed in the person of Jesus a service to the world in the bid to assess the models for the training of priests in south eastern Nigeria the author using a historical critical method traced the history of the models and events that shaped the current modules for the training of priests in south eastern Nigeria at the end of the historical research he proffered some suggestions for improvement amendment and solidification of the training of priests in the area as one of the younger African churches the examination of the training of priests in south eastern Nigeria will also serve as a paradigm or typology for understanding the dynamics and the process of training of priests in other African countries since most of these local churches share relatively similar historical cultural economic and socio political circumstances

Fr Eusèbe M Ménard O F M was gifted with a visionary perspective regarding God's call to adults for ministry in the Catholic Church specifically priestly vocations in the mid 1940s Ménard proposed an innovative idea for training men called to serve God through the priesthood college seminaries for belated vocations as he defined it a man with a belated vocation had not heard God's call in his early years or having heard it did not or could not act upon it at that time the events leading to the formation and development of Holy Apostles College Seminary proved challenging and at times painful for those people who joined Ménard in this enterprise still it appeared from the start that the hand of God was truly at work in the concept

acquisition and development of holy apostles this study documents the founding and initial development of holy apostles and highlights several significant events from the first forty years of its service to the catholic church

in a companion to priesthood and holy orders in the middle ages a select group of scholars explain the rise and function of priests and deacons in the middle ages though priests were sometimes viewed through the lens of function the medieval priesthood was also defined ontologically those marked by god who performed the sacraments and confected the eucharist while their role grew in importance medieval priests continued to fulfil the role of preacher confessor and provider of pastoral care as the concept of ordination changed theologically the practices and status of bishops priests and deacons continued to be refined with many of these medieval discussions continuing to the present day

the concept and institution of priesthood in the catholic church has been the subject of serious challenge not only since the time of the protestant reformation but also more recently from within the catholic church as the second vatican council 1962 1965 and theologians afterward have reconsidered the place and function of priests in relation to both bishops and laity in dialogue with those challenges and by means of research into scripture and the theological tradition patristic medieval and modern the author of this book considers classic images of priests and priestly ministry as a way of recovering an understanding of the priesthood that is at once both biblically and theological sound

from 1962 to 1965 in perhaps the most important religious event of the twentieth century the second vatican council met to plot a course for the future of the roman catholic church after thousands of speeches resolutions and votes the council issued sixteen official documents on topics ranging from divine revelation to relations with non christians in many ways

though the real challenges began after the council was over and catholics began to argue over the interpretation of the documents many analysts perceived the council's far reaching changes as breaks with church tradition and soon this became the dominant bias in the american and other media which lacked the theological background to approach the documents on their own terms in vatican ii renewal within tradition an international team of theologians offers a different reading of the documents from vatican ii the council was indeed putting forth a vision for the future of the church but that vision was grounded in two millennia of tradition taken together these essays demonstrate that vatican ii's documents are a development from an established antecedent in the roman catholic church each chapter contextualizes vatican ii teachings within that rich tradition the resulting book is an indispensable and accessible companion to the council's developments one that focuses on theology and transcends the mass media storyline of liberal versus conservative
