the greatest tragic writer among the english novelists virginia woolf with its depiction of the wronged pure woman tess and its powerful criticism of victorian hypocrisy tess of the d urbervilles is one of the most moving and poetic of hardy s novels when its heroine tess durbeyfield is driven by family poverty to claim kinship with the wealthy d urbervilles meeting her cousin alec proves to be her downfall a very different man angel clare seems to offer her love and salvation but tess must choose whether to reveal her past or remain silent in the hope of a peaceful future edited with notes by tim dolin and an introduction by margaret r higonnet

thomas hardy has long been critically constructed as poet of wessex and novelist of character and environment this volume offers to deconstruct such a mythic hardy in selecting contemporary critical essays which re present tess from very different critical perspectives feminist cultural materialist and poststructuralist approaches in particular explore gender class and language by way of the novel s riven textuality in the process the introduction claims tess emerges as a potent postmodern text

language of fiction was the first book of criticism by the renowned novelist and critic david lodge his uniquely informed perspective he was already the author of three successful novels at the time of its first publication in 1966 and lucid exposition meant that the work proved a landmark of literary criticism not least because it succeeded

the books we ve read the films we ve seen the stories we ve heard and just as importantly the ones we haven t form an integral part of our identity recognising a reference to a text can result in feelings of pleasure expertise and even smugness being lost as to a reference s possible significance can lead to alienation from a text or conversation intertextuality in practice offers readers a cognitively grounded framework for hands on analysis of intertextuality both in written texts and spoken discourse the book offers a historical overview of existing research highlighting that most of this work focuses on what intertextuality is conceptually rather than how it can be identified described and analysed drawing on research from literary criticism neuroscience linguistics and sociology this book proposes a cognitive stylistic approach presenting the narrative interrelation framework as a way of operationalising the concept of intertextuality to enable close practical analysis

molly youngkin takes on a major literary problem of the turn of the century was the transition from the victorian novel to the modern novel enabled by antirealist or realist narrative strategies to answer this question youngkin analyzes book reviews that appeared in two prominent feminist periodicals circulated during the late victorian era shafts and the woman s herald through reviews of the works of important male and female authors of the decade thomas hardy sarah grand george gissing mona caird george meredith ménie dowie george moore and henrietta stannard these periodicals developed a feminist realist aesthetic that drew on three aspects of woman s agency consciousness spoken word and action and emphasized corresponding narrative strategies internal perspective dialogue and description of characters actions still these periodicals privileged consciousness over spoken word and action and by doing so encouraged authors to push the boundaries of traditional realism and anticipate the modernist aesthetic by acknowledging the role of the woman s press in the development of the novel this book revises our understanding of the transition from victorianism to modernism which often is characterized as antirealist late victorian authors working within the realist tradition also contributed to this transition particularly through their engagement with feminist realism youngkin deftly illustrates this transition and in so doing proves that it cannot be attributed to antirealist narrative strategies alone molly youngkin takes on a major literary problem of the turn of the century was the transition from the victorian novel to the modern novel enabled by antirealist or realist narrative strategies to answer this question youngkin analyzes book

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focusing on the long nineteenth century from the french revolution to the beginnings of modernism this book examines the significance of memory in this era of turbulent social change through investigation of science literature history and the visual arts the authors explore theories of memory and the cultural and literary resonances of memorializing drawing on the work of many of the most influential literary figures of the period such as tennyson scott and hardy memory and memorials explores key topics such as gender and memory victorian psychological theories of memory and cultural constructions in literature science history and architecture memory and memorials from the french revolution to world war one employs a range of new and influential interdisciplinary methodologies it offers both a fresh theoretical understanding of the period and a wealth of empirical material of use to the historian literary critic or social psychologist
