this is the first book to provide a direct and comprehensive account of british art cinema film history has tended to view british filmmakers as aesthetically conservative but the truth is they have a long tradition of experiment and artistry both within and beyond the mainstream beginning with the silent period and running up to the 2010s the book draws attention to this tradition while acknowledging that art cinema in britain is a complex and fluid concept that needs to be considered within broader concerns it will be of particular interest to scholars and students of british cinema history film genre experimental filmmaking and british cultural history

since cinema's earliest days literary adaptation has provided the movies with stories and so we use literary terms like metaphor metonymy and synecdoche to describe visual things but there is another way of looking at film and that is through its relationship with the visual arts mainly painting the oldest of the art forms art history for filmmakers is an inspiring guide to how images from art can be used by filmmakers to establish period detail and to teach composition color theory and lighting the book looks at the key moments in the

development of the western painting and how these became part of the western visual culture from which cinema emerges before exploring how paintings can be representative of different genres such as horror sex violence realism and fantasy and how the images in these paintings connect with cinema insightful case studies explore the links between art and cinema through the work of seven high profile filmmakers including peter greenaway peter webber jack cardiff martin scorsese guillermo del toro quentin tarantino and stan douglas a range of practical exercises are included in the text which can be carried out singly or in small teams featuring stunning full color images art history for filmmakers provides budding filmmakers with a practical guide to how images from art can help to develop their understanding of the visual language of film

the formation of chinese art cinema 1990 2003 examines the development of chinese art film in the people's republic of china from 1990 when the first sixth generation film mama was released to 2003 when authorities acknowledged the legitimacy of underground filmmakers through an exploration of the production and consecration mechanisms of the new art wave and its representative styles this book argues that the art wave of the 1990s fundamentally defined chinese art cinema in particular this vital art wave was not enabled by democratic liberalism but by the specific industrial development in which the film system transitioned from socialist propaganda

into a commercialized entity allowing chinese art film to grow but at the same time denying its legitimacy this paradoxical transition process shaped chinese art film s institutional and aesthetical alternative positioning which eventually helped consolidate the art wave into art cinema ultimately this bookis a history of the chinese portion of global art cinema which also reveals the complex chinese cultural experiences during the reform era

art cinema has for over fifty years defined how audiences and critics imagine film outside hollywood but surprisingly little scholarly attention has been paid to the concept since the 1970s and yet in the last thirty years art cinema has flourished worldwide the emergence of east asian and latin american new waves the reinvigoration of european film the success of iranian directors and the rise of the film festival have transformed the landscape of world cinema this book brings into focus art cinema s core internationalism demonstrating its centrality to understanding film as a global phenomenon the book reassesses the field of art cinema in light of recent scholarship on world film cultures in addition to analysis of key regions and films the essays cover topics including

drawing on case studies of films including charlie kaufman s synecdoche new york nuri bilge ceylan s climates and john akomfrah s the nine muses this books asks to what extent is politics shaping art cinema and in turn could art cinema possibly affect the political structure of the world as we know it

art cinema occupies a space in the film landscape that is accorded a particular kind of value from films that claim the status of harsh realism to others which embody aspects of the tradition of modernism or the poetic art cinema encompasses a variety of work from across the globe but how is art cinema positioned in the film marketplace or by critics and in academic analysis exactly what kinds of cultural value are attributed to films of this type and how can this be explained this book offers a unique analysis of how such processes work including the broader cultural basis of the appeal of art cinema to particular audiences geoff king argues that there is no single definition of art cinema but a number of distinct and recurrent tendencies are identified at one end of the spectrum are films accorded the most heavyweight status offering the greatest challenges to viewers others mix aspects of art cinema with more accessible dimensions such as uses of popular genre frameworks and exploitation elements involving explicit sex and violence including case studies of key figures such as michael haneke pedro almodóvar and jean pierre and luc dardenne this is a crucial contribution to understanding both art cinema itself and the discourses through which its value is established

bringing together twenty five years of work on what he has called the historical poetics of cinema david bordwell presents an extended analysis of a key question for film studies how are films made in particular historical contexts in order to achieve certain effects for bordwell films are made things existing within historical contexts and aim to create determinate effects beginning with this central thesis bordwell works out a full understanding of how films channel and recast cultural influences for their cinematic purposes with more than five hundred film stills poetics of cinema is a must have for any student of cinema

publications sought to foster a new cinematic culture for the new nation fueled by enthusiasm for a future of progress and development good films would help make good citizens art cinema would not only earn global prestige but also shape discerning individuals capable of exercising aesthetic and political judgment during the 1960s however satyajit ray mrinal sen and ritwik ghatak the leading figures of indian art cinema became disillusioned with the belief that film was integral to national development instead majumdar contends their works captured the unresolvable contradictions of the postcolonial present which pointed toward possible yet unrealized futures analyzing the films of ray sen and ghatak and working through previously unexplored archives of film society publications majumdar offers a radical reinterpretation of indian film history art cinema and india s forgotten futures offers sweeping new insights into film s relationship with the postcolonial condition and its role in decolonial imaginations of the future

in a modernist cinema sixteen distinguished scholars in the field of the new modernist studies explore the interrelationships among cinema modernism across the arts and modernity in the period 1914 to 1941 each of the fifteen chapters focuses on at least one influential film by a major director from europe america or asia including pastrone griffith eisenstein lang hitchcock murnau dreyer vertov buñuel ozu ford renior chaplin riefenstahl and welles contributors explore the formal and aesthetic qualities silent and early sound films in relation to their social cultural and political context and with particular attention to the challenges crises and promise of modern life in the first half of the 20th century

bringing together established and emerging scholars from multiple disciplines the collection s unique contribution is to show how angelopoulos created singularly intricate forms whose aesthetic contours invite us to think critically about modern history

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
