the romantic age was one of anger and its consequences revolution and reaction terror and war andrew m stauffer explores the changing place of anger in the literature and culture of the period as english men and women rethought their relationship to the aggressive passions in the wake of the french revolution drawing on diverse fields and discourses such as aesthetics politics medicine and the law and tracing the classical legacy the romantics inherited stauffer charts the period s struggle to define the relationship of anger to justice and the creative self in their poetry and prose romantic authors including blake coleridge godwin shelley and byron negotiate the meanings of indignation and rage amidst a clamorous debate over the place of anger in art and in civil society this innovative book has much to contribute to the understanding of romantic literature and the cultural history of the emotions

scholars do not agree on how best to describe shelley s philosophical stance his work has been variously taken to be that of a skeptic or a skeptical and subjective idealist the study presents a new interpretation of shelley s thinking an interpretation that places intellectual system squarely within the epicurean tradition of lucretius casting both poets as theistic empiricists to establish shelley as working in the epicurean tradition this study explores lucretius de rerum natura as edited translated and interpreted by two epicurean scholars roughly contemporary with shelley gilbert wakefield and john mason good these scholars rehabilitated lucretius by drawing on three major seventeenth century thinkers pierre gassendi ralph cudworth and nicholas malebranche like shelley each of these thinkers rejected the reduction of philosophy to mechanical and atomistic elements a reduction which shelley referred to as materialism or popular dualism what shelley rejected is a clue to what he embraced a fusion of enlightenment rationalism with british empiricism such a fusion is the distinguishing mark of the work of sir william drummond the only contemporary philosopher that shelley consistently praised this is the tradition within which shelley ultimately stands one that brings into balance what is given to the mind a priori and what the mind creates

Writing to his publisher in 1813, Shelley expressed the hope that two of his major works should form one volume. Nearly two centuries later, the second volume of the Johns Hopkins edition of the complete poetry fulfills that wish. For the first time, this volume collects two important pieces: *Queen Mab* and the *Esdaile Notebook*, privately issued in 1813. *Queen Mab* was perhaps Shelley's most intellectually ambitious work, articulating his views of science, politics, history, religion, society, and individual human relations. Subtitled a philosophical poem with notes, it became his most influential and pirated poem during much of the nineteenth century, a favorite among reformers and radicals. The *Esdaile Notebook*, a cycle of fifty-eight early poems, exhibits an astonishing range of verse forms unpublished until 1964. This sequence is vital in understanding how the poet mastered his craft, as in the acclaimed first volume. These works have been critically edited by Donald H. Reiman and Neil Fraistat. The poems are presented as Shelley intended, with textual variants included in footnotes. Following the poems are extensive discussions of the circumstances of their composition and the influences they reflect, their publication or circulation by other means, their reception at the time of publication, and in the decades since their republication, both authorized and unauthorized, and their place in Shelley's intellectual and aesthetic development.

As eighteenth-century scholarship expands its range and disciplinary boundaries, such as enlightenment and romanticism, are challenged. Novels published during the rich period from 1750 to 1832 have become a contested site of critical overlap. In this volume, scholars who typically write under the rubric of either the long eighteenth century or romanticism examine novels often claimed by both scholarly periods. This shared enterprise opens new and rich discussions of novels and novelistic concerns by creating dialogue across scholarly boundaries. Dominant narratives, critical approaches, and methodological assumptions differ in important ways, but these differences reveal a productive tension among the issues engaged. Are the eighteenth-century novel's development of emotional interiority, including theories of melancholia, the troubling heritage of the epistolary novel, for the 1790s radical novel, tensions between rationality and romantic affect, issues of aesthetics and politics, and constructions of gender, genre, and race, rather than positing a simple opposition between an eighteenth-century enlightenment of rationality, propriety, and progress and a romantic period of inspiration, heroic individualism, and sublime

emotionality these essays trace the putatively romantic in the early 1700s as well as the long legacy of enlightenment values and ideas well into the nineteenth century the volume concludes with responses from patricia meyer spacks and stephen c behrendt who situate the essays and elaborate on the stakes

rosemary ashton explores the many facets of samuel taylor coleridge's complex personality by turns poet critic thinker enchanting companion feckless husband fabled conversationalist and guilt ridden opium addict

this book explores the boundaries of british continental travel and tourism in the nineteenth century stretching from norway to bulgaria from visitors albums to missionary efforts from juvenilia to joint authorship the essay topics invoke new aesthetics of travel as consumption travel as satire and of the developing culture of tourism chronologically arranged the book charts the growth and permutations of this new consumerist ideology of travel driven by the desires of both men and women the insatiable appetite for new accounts of old routes as well as appropriation of the new interart reproductions of description and illustration and wider cultural manifestations of tourism within popular entertainment and domestic settings continental tourism provides multiple perspectives with wide ranging coverage of cultural phenomena increasingly incorporated into and affected by the nineteenth century continental tour the essays suggest the coextension of travel alongside experiential boundaries and reveal the emergence of a consumerist attitude toward travel that persists in the present day

challenging the idea that a writer's work reflects his experiences in time and place Cooper locates the action of William Blake's major illuminated books in the ahistorical present an impersonal spirit realm beyond the three dimensional self historicist attempts to place Blake's vision in perspective Cooper argues involve a self contradictory denial of his performativity as a poet artist of multiple geometrical dimensions

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
