in this concluding volume of the series disciplines in art education an author art critic and an art educator discuss the place of the art criticism in the classroom

this book explores a range of social institutional and discursive conditions in and through which criticism emerged and functioned in 19th century france and goes on to develop broader theoretical questions drawn from historical case studies

this volume examines the criticism of five influential british writers on the visual arts john ruskin walter pater roger fry clive bell and sir herbert read their works span a period in the history of art that in productivity and significance is more impressive than any other period since the renaissance each of these writers possesses extraordinary literary skills another common tie is their awareness of serving as spokesmen for art to an audience that was mainly indifferent or even hostile even though the aesthetic outlook of pater fry and bell represents a violent reaction to ruskin's moralistic and literary interpretation of art they were no less concerned than he to overcome the national apathy toward art and to assert its cultural importance sir herbert read reconciles the oppositions in the work of his predecessors in an aesthetic philosophy that stresses the social and ethnical values of art without sacrificing the idea of individual expression the major part of solomon fishman's study is an examination of the aesthetic theories embodied in the writings of each critic he extracts the theoretical assumptions that form the basis of each writer's critical practice and traces the development of aesthetic doctrine as it was modified by the critic's experience of actual works of art the body of work of these writers is representative of the whole development of modern art criticism and aesthetic theory although they display great diversity in ideas and taste all five critics were instrumental in shaping the response of the public first of all toward art in general and finally toward modern art their work represents a unified segment of the larger enterprise to understand and illuminate art and will interest anyone who wishes to enlarge their own understanding this title is part of uc press's voices revived program which commemorates university of california press's mission to seek out and cultivate the brightest minds and give them voice reach and impact drawing on a backlist dating to 1893 voices revived makes high quality peer reviewed scholarship accessible once again using print on demand technology this

excerpt from elements of art criticism comprising a treatise on the principles of man's nature as addressed by art together with a historic survey of the methods of art execution in the departments of drawing sculpture architecture painting landscaping gardening and the decorative arts the following treatise on the elements of art criticism has originated in a conviction that the general neglect of early instruction in the principles of art execution is a serious defect in american education which defect may be and therefore should be removed the educated american tourist finds himself mortified amid the galleries and before the monuments of art in the old world because unlike european visitors he has no preparatory acquaintance with the first principles of art kindred to his early instruction in science and literature which would make him at home among such treasures and fit him to appreciate to enjoy and to improve his privilege the american legislator obliged by his position to take action in meeting the great and growing demand for public expenditures in the department of painting sculpture and architecture is harassed with the apprehension that having no independent judgment of his own he may be misled by unworthy and interested men who are ever in advance of genuine artists in pressing their own claims the young american artist has rarely access to technical historical and critical treatises on art which may give clearness and comprehensiveness to his investigations and conceptions to this special lack of these several special classes must be added the general want felt by the entire mass of the american people male and female youths and adults pre-eminently an educated and reading people who though supplied with elementary treatises in every department of science and philosophy search in vain in american and even in english libraries for a condensed and comprehensive work on art which shall meet their general need the demand is a peculiar one and the effort to meet it is attended with great difficulty about the publisher forgotten books publishes hundreds of thousands of rare and classic books find more at forgottenbooks.com this book is a reproduction of an important historical work forgotten books uses state of the art technology to digitally reconstruct the work preserving the original format whilst repairing imperfections present in the aged copy in rare cases an imperfection in the original such as a blemish or missing page may be replicated in our edition we do however repair the vast majority of imperfections successfully any imperfections that remain are intentionally left to preserve the state of such historical works
