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introducing advanced macroeconomics growth and business cycles 2nd edition provides students with a thorough understanding of fundamental models in macroeconomics and introduces them to methods of formal macroeconomic analysis split into two sections the first half of the book focuses on macroeconomics for the long run introducing and developing basic models of growth and structural unemployment the second half of the book deals with the economy in the short run focusing on the explanation of business fluctuations this new edition retains the popular pitch and level established in the 1st edition and continues to bridge the gap between intermediate macroeconomics texts and more advanced textbooks

in the conventional discourse on macroeconomics the subject of human development is at best marginal and at worst irrelevant in the unconventional discourse on human

development macroeconomics or its constraints are seldom recognised even if its consequences are often highlighted there are however intersections and interconnections which provide the rationale for this book that seeks to map some broad contours of an unexplored yet important domain macroeconomics is important for human development because it determines levels of employment the degree of social protection and the public provision of services such as healthcare or education human development has implications and consequences for macroeconomics for it can mobilize or claim resources to enlarge or diminish space for macroeconomic policies the relationship exists and matters not only in poor countries but also in wealthy ones employment even if neglected provides the critical link this book shows that causation runs in both directions and can be either positive or negative it reveals similarities and differences between developing countries and industrialised countries the political context is significant everywhere as interests ideology and institutions influence economic policies in both spheres to shape outcomes this book was originally published as a special issue of the journal of human development and capabilities

the study of economic development is inherently grounded in philosophical and ethical assumptions in other words to discuss economic development either at a conceptual level or as a real process necessitates an ethical and philosophical basis the authors of this book believe that islamic economics can serve as such a basis one that emanates from islamic principles and values this book presents a distinctive ethical and philosophical framework one that is grounded in islamic principles and the established literature of islamic economics and finance to analyse and interpret the concept of economic development as well as to propose policy solutions to real world development problems and challenges the book contains theoretical and empirical studies which connect the literature of islamic economics with economic development while some chapters discuss development at the conceptual philosophical level others examine the real world issues faced by developing countries it proposes institutional constructs as well as concrete public policies to face developmental challenges such as fighting poverty and inequality environmental and social sustainability industrialisation and industrial policy and social services and human capital serving as both an introduction and a comprehensive resource this book illustrates how the concepts and problems of economic development can be examined from an islamic economics perspective and as such will equip researchers and students with a basic understanding of how islamic economics interacts with the issues of economic development

useful in examining the issues of economic development growth theory provides a rich and versatile analytical framework through which fundamental questions about economic development can be examined structural transformation in which developing countries transition from traditional production in largely rural areas to modern production in largely urban areas is an important causal force in creating early economic growth and as such is made central in this approach towards this end the authors augment the solow model to include endogenous theories of saving fertility human capital institutional arrangements and policy formation creating a single two sector model of structural transformation based on applied research and practical experiences in macroeconomic development the model in this book presents a more rigorous quantifiable and explicitly dynamic dual economy approach to development common microeconomic foundations and notation are used throughout with each chapter building on the previous material in a continuous flow revised and updated to include more exercises for guided self study as well as a technical appendix covering required mathematical topics beyond calculus the second edition is appropriate for both upper undergraduate and graduate students studying development economics and macroeconomics

in response to the damage caused by a growth led global economy researchers across the world started investigating the association between environmental pollution and its possible determinants using different models and techniques most famously the environmental kuznets curve hypothesizes an inverted u shaped association between environmental quality and gross domestic product gdp this book explores the latest literature on the environmental kuznets curve including developments in the methodology the impacts of the pandemic and other recent findings researchers have recently broadened the range of the list of drivers of environmental pollution under consideration which now includes variables such as foreign direct investment trade expansion financial development human activities population growth and renewable and nonrenewable energy resources all of which vary across different countries and times and in addition to co2 emissions other proxies for environmental quality such as water land and ecological footprints have been used in recent studies this book also incorporates analysis of the relationship between economic growth and the environment during the covid 19 crisis presenting new empirical work on the impact of the pandemic on energy use the financial sector trade and tourism collectively these developments have improved the direction and extent of the environmental kuznets curve hypothesis and broadened the basket of dependent and independent variables which may be incorporated this book will be invaluable reading for researchers in environmental economics and econometrics
