the temptations of a new genetically informed eugenics and of a revived faith based world wide political stance this study of the interaction of science religion politics and the culture of celebrity in twentieth century europe and america offers a fascinating and important contribution to the history of this movement the author looks at the career of french born physician and nobel prize winner alexis carrel 1873 1944 as a way of understanding the popularization of eugenics through religious faith scientific expertise cultural despair and right wing politics in the 1930s and 1940s carrel was among the most prestigious experimental surgeons of his time who also held deeply illiberal views in man the unknown 1935 he endorsed fascism and called for the elimination of the unfit the book became a huge international success largely thanks to its promotion by readers digest as well as by the author s friendship with charles lindbergh in 1941 he went into the service of the french pro german regime of vichy which appointed him to head an institution of eugenics research his influence was remarkable affecting radical islamic groups as well le pen s front national that celebrated him as the founder of ecology

in renegotiating french identity jane fulcher addresses the question of cultural resistance to the german occupation and vichy regime during the second world war nazi germany famously stressed music as a marker of national identity and cultural achievement but so too did vichy from the opera to the symphony music did not only serve the interests of vichy and german propaganda it also helped to reveal the motives behind them and to awaken resistance among

those growing disillusioned by the regime using unexplored resistance documents from both the clandestine press and the french national archives fulcher looks at the responses of specific artists and their means of resistance addressing in turn pierre schaeffer arthur honegger francis poulenc and olivier messiaen among others this book investigates the role that music played in fostering a profound awareness of the cultural and political differences between conflicting french ideological positions as criticism of vichy and its policies mounted

the state s policy with regard to fathers and fatherhood had a great impact on concepts of citizenship and gender in france in the era of the two world wars drawing on new material that has only recently become available from the archives of the vichy regime kristen stromberg childers analyzes the ways fathers were promoted as saviors of the nation after france s humiliating defeat by the germans in june 1940 childers argues that concern for the family and for the status of fathers in modern france was not merely a response to falling birthrates and german aggression but was fundamental to the very notion of citizenship and political participation the debate on men as gendered beings childers demonstrates is central to the political social and cultural history of france in the modern age the father figure became a focus as participants from all classes and across the political spectrum debated what was wrong with the french family and what policies were needed to remedy the problem childers examines how these policies were implemented what they reveal about the development of the welfare state in france and how they help explain the importance of vichy in twentieth century french history twenty eight illustrations including fifteen photographs many never previously published complement her argument

the roman noir in post war french culture offers a lively introduction to the post war french roman noir from a cultural studies perspective a populist and widely disseminated genre the french roman noir has suffered from a reputation as a minor genre with its roots in american popular culture in this study claire gorrara challenges such preconceptions and examines how selected writers have appropriated the roman noir as a critical response to formative concerns and debates in post war french society starting with the first truly french roman noir léo malet s 120 rue de la gare 1943 and concluding with maud tabachnik s feminist thriller un été pourri 1994 gorrara analyses both texts and film in relation to their specific historical and cultural context from the heritage of the second world war and france s wars of decolonisation to the rise of consumer culture and questions of gender and sexual equality the roman noir operates in dialogue with its times mediating social change and transformation with stories of crime transgression and marginality all the novelists studied were published initially in popular collections such as the série noire but they have been chosen for the innovation of their work and the exciting ways in which they resist tired conventions and offer new ways of representing social reality one of the first english language studies of this popular genre the roman noir in post war french culture offers much more than close readings of these fascinating texts it demonstrates the important contribution of the roman noir to the cultural histories of post war france

this is the first book in either english or french to offer readers an overview of women s experience of the second world war and its immediate aftermath in france it examines objectively the part that women played in both collaboration and resistance synthesising much recent scholarship on the subject in french and english and drawing on the author s own extensive research including oral testimony in toulouse paris and west brittany the findings are complex and the immensely varied testimony challenges easy generalisation this will be relevant for courses on french studies french and european history and women s studies

the creators of the vichy regime did not intend merely to shield france from the worst effects of military defeat and occupation rather the leaders of vichy were inspired by a will to regenerate france to establish an authoritarian new order that would repair the degenerative effects of parliamentary democracy and liberal society their plan to effect this change took the form of a far reaching programme they called the national revolution this is the first study of the national revolution as the expression of vichy s ideology and aims it reveals the variety and complexity of both right wing and other strands of french thought in the context of the turbulent years of the 1930s when vichy s history really begins and under the occupation when internal rivalries and divisions as well as the pressures of war doomed vichy s programme of national regeneration the book is structured around a consideration of the rhetoric of right wing ideology and such key catchwords as decadence action order realism and new man and shows how these phrases only served to mask the political and ideological incoherence of the vichy government

contemporary literature gathers in a commemorative site the remains of h history and its own story by erecting literary tombs necrofiction and the politics of literary memory argues that current narratives of the aftermath enable writers to honour the past while casting off its burdensome legacy and to dismantle while reassembling affective political and aesthetic communities the genre is defined and discussed in relation to other literary forms such as trauma writing historical novels archival narratives biofiction or field literature necrofiction fulfils in distinct ways the social and artistic function of an individual or collective act of remembrance of a lost family member or a historical figure at the same time it offers a creative space in which the authors can overcome the burden of literary tradition by incorporating existing models and devices into their own poetic art while as demonstrated by the works of five writers whose personal and artistic trajectories transcend political cultural and linguistic frontiers linda lê patrick

modiano assia djebar patrick chamoiseau and maylis de kerangal by examining the ways in which fiction both reflects and resists what achille mbembe has defined as necropolitics necrofiction and the politics of literary memory delves into the contentious yet intimate relationship between singular models of literary remembrance and the frameworks of hegemonic discourses

few books on european history in recent memory have caused such controversy and commotion wrote robert wohl in 1991 in a major review of neither right nor left listed by le monde as one of the forty most important books published in france during the 1980s this explosive work asserts that fascism was an important part of the mainstream of european history not just a temporary development in germany and italy but a significant aspect of french culture as well neither right nor left fascism united antibourgeois antiliberal nationalism and revolutionary syndicalist thought each of which joined in reflecting the political culture inherited from eighteenth century france from the first sternhell s argument generated strong feelings among people who wished to forget the vichy years and his themes drew enormous public attention in 1994 as paul touvier was condemned for crimes against humanity and a new biography probed president mitterand s vichy connections the author s new preface speaks to the debates of 1994 and reinforces the necessity of acknowledging the past as president chirac has recently done on france s behalf
