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a provocative book an important book jagodzinski s and wallin s betrayal is in fact a wake up call for art based research a loving critique of its directions jagodzinski s and wallin s reference is the question what art can do not what it means theirs is an ultimate affirmation that uncovers the singularities that compose and give consistency to art not as an object but as an event their betrayal consists in an affirmation of life and becoming positing a performative machinics of the arts which is in absolute contraposition with the hegemonic discourse of art and as an object of knowledge and representation this does not only concern academia but also politics and ethics an untimely book that comes just at the right time bernd herzogenrath goethe universität frankfurt am main germany author of an american body politic a deleuzian approach and editor of

deleuze ecology and travels in intermedia lity reblurring the boundaries approaching the creative impulse in the arts from the philosophical perspectives of deleuze guattari jagodzinski and wallin make a compelling argument for blurring the boundaries of arts based research in the field of art education the authors contend that the radical ideas of leading scholars in the field are not radical enough due to their reliance on existing research ontologies and those that end in epistemological representations in contrast they propose arts based research as the event of ontological immanence an incipient machinic process of becoming research through arts practice that enables seeing and thinking in irreducible ways while resisting normalization and subsumption under existing modes of address as such arts practice as research in the making constitutes a betrayal of prevailing cultural assumptions according to the authors an interminable renouncement of normalized research representations in favor of the contingent problematic that emerges during arts practice charlesr garoian professor of art education penn state university author of the prosthetic pedagogy of art jagodzinski and wallin have written a challenging book on the theme of betrayal which aims to question the metaphysical ground of the practice of many arts educators and researchers dismantling the notion of praxis which assumes a prior will as well as the pervasive notion of the creative and reflexive individual they revisit the notion of poiesis and the truth of appearing in order to advocate the centrality of becoming in pedagogical relations is it possible to develop pedagogies beyond those images of thought that attenuate learners teachers and researchers we need a new image of thought or better a thought without image and this book asks us to take up the challenge dennis atkinson director of the centre for the arts and learning department of educational studies goldsmiths university of london author of art equality and learning pedagogies against the state

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the handbook is heavy on methods chapters in different genres there are chapters on actual methods that include methodological instruction and examples there is also ample attention given to practical issues including evaluation writing ethics and publishing with respect to writing style contributors have made their chapters reader friendly by limiting their use of jargon providing methodological instruction when appropriate and offering robust research examples from their own work and or others

arts based research in theatre and performance provides a roadmap for conducting arts based research it offers a vibrant exploration of how ethnography autoethnography poetry and fiction can be used successfully in research projects this volume delves into a rich array of works from the theatre and performance canon reframing them through the lens of arts based research readers are introduced to the innovative methodologies and bold contributions of diverse artists and scholars both contemporary and historical who may help redefine how readers understand document and engage with performance as arts based research each chapter walks the reader through practical exercises so they can develop their techniques and research projects with reflections on professional and academic practice throughout this is an accessible guide for students and practitioners wanting to conduct their own arts based research in theatre performance drama therapy drama education applied theatre and other similar fields

this project addresses the contexts of practice as research and how to undertake it this second iteration updates thinking and practices but sustains a direct and clear approach on how to become a practitioner researcher new features include an extension of range beyond the arts and a case for intra disciplinarity in practice research as an influence in the formation of the future university a comparison is made between artistic research and practice research recognizing that research through practices with being doing knowing is central to both acknowledging the current crisis in legitimation a broad view is taken of how things might be known by an onto epistemology for the twenty first century foregrounding the bodymind but sustaining rationality and community by way of other other dialogic exchange perspectives from around the world in part ii offset the more eurocentric emphasis in part i

awarded grsig s honerable mention for 2021 2020 aesa critics choice book award winner arts based educational research and qualitative inquiry introduces novice qualitative researchers within education and related fields to arts based educational research aber abundant prompts and exercises are provided to help readers apply the concepts and experiment with various applications of the ideas presented the authors walk the path with novice researchers offering a variety of approaches to the practice of arts based methods while providing a guided overview of aber and include pedagogical features in each chapter exercises are designed to assist educational researchers who wish to expand their repertoire of methodologies the authors also weave into the discussion the possibilities and limitations of many types of arts based methods while introducing readers to the growing methodological literature by offering a tapestry of ways to engage the novice researcher the book illustrates that it is not always possible to separate cognitive findings from aesthetic knowing this book will help qualitative researchers to expand their methodologies to include arts based approaches to their projects and by doing so reshape their identities as qualitative researchers it also offers some evaluative criteria and tool kits for experimenting with various arts and educational research
