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the year is 1914 and amelia pim will soon be thirteen there are rumours of war and rebellion and dublin is holding its breath for major dramatic events but all that matters to amelia is what she will wear to her birthday party and how she can be the envy of her friends but where are amelia s friends when disaster strikes her family now that the pims have come down in the world what use will amelia have for a shimmering emerald green dress when mama s political activities bring the final disgrace it is amelia who must hold the family together only the friendship of the servant girl mary ann seems to promise any hope

it's 1916 but Amelia Pim's thoughts are on Frederick Goodbody and not on the war in Europe. Then Frederick enlists. The pacifist Quaker community is shocked but Amelia is secretly proud of her hero and goes to the quayside to wave him farewell for her friend Maryann. There are problems too with her brother's involvement in the Easter Rising. What will become of the two young men and what effect will it have on the lives of Amelia and Maryann? Irish Children's Literature and Culture looks critically at Irish writing for children from the 1980s to the present, examining the work of many writers and illustrators and engaging with major genres, forms and issues including the gothic, the speculative, picturebooks, ethnicity and globalization. It contextualizes modern Irish children's literature in relation to Irish mythology and earlier writings as well as in relation to Irish writing for adults, thereby demonstrating the complexity of this fascinating area. What constitutes a national literature is rarely straightforward and it is especially complex when discussing writing for young people in an Irish context. Until recently there was only a slight body of work that could be classified as Irish children's literature. In comparison with Ireland's contribution to adult literature in the twentieth century, the contributors to the volume examine a range of texts in relation to contemporary literary and cultural theory and children's literature internationally, raising provocative questions about the future of the topic. *Irish Children's Literature and Culture* is essential reading for those interested in Irish literature, culture, sociology, childhood and children's literature. In the context of changing constructs of home and of childhood since the mid twentieth century, this book examines discourses of home and homeland in Irish children's fiction from 1990 to 2012, a time of dramatic change in Ireland spanning the rise and fall of the Celtic Tiger and of unprecedented growth in Irish children's literature. Close readings of selected texts by five award-winning authors are linked to social, intellectual and political changes in the period covered and draw on postcolonial, feminist, cultural and children's literature theory, highlighting the political and ideological dimensions of home and the value of children's literature as a lens through which to view culture and society as well as an imaginative space where young people can engage with complex ideas relevant to their lives and the world in which they live. Examining the works of O'Riordan, Kate Thompson, Eoin Colfer, Siobhán Parkinson and Siobhán Dowd, Ciara Ní Bhroin argues that Irish children's literature changed at this time from being a vehicle that largely promoted hegemonic ideologies of home in post-independence Ireland to a site of resistance to complacent notions of home in Celtic Tiger Ireland.

It is 1916 and Europe is at war. From the poverty of the Dublin slums, twelve-year-old Jimmy

conway sees it all as glorious and loves the british army for which his father is fighting but when war comes to his own streets jimmy s loyalties are divided the rebels occupy the general post office and other parts of the city and jimmy s uncle is among them dublin s streets are destroyed business comes to a halt in an attempt to find food for his family jimmy crosses the city avoiding the shooting weaving through the army patrols hoping to make it home before curfew but his quest is not easy and danger threatens at every corner

while much has been written about irish culture s apparent obsession with the past and with representing childhood few critics have explored in detail the position of children s fiction within such discourses this book serves to redress these imbalances illuminating both the manner in which children s texts engage with complex cultural discourses in contemporary ireland and the significant contribution that children s novels and films can make to broader debates concerning irish identity at the end of the twentieth and beginning of the twenty first centuries through close analysis of specific books and films published or produced since 1990 irish childhoods offers an insight into contrasting approaches to the representation of irish history and childhood in recent children s fiction each chapter interrogates the unique manner in which an author or filmmaker engages with twentieth century irish history from a contemporary perspective and reveals that constructions of childhood in irish children s fiction are often used to explore aspects of ireland s past and present

this book explores the ways in which five female radical novelists of the 1790s elizabeth inchbald eliza fenwick mary hays charlotte smith and mary wollstonecraft attempted to use the components of private life to work toward widespread social reform these writers depict the conjugal family as the site for a potential reformation of the prejudices and flaws of the biological family the biological family in the radical novels of female writers is fraught with problems greed and selfishness pervert the relationships between siblings and neglect and ignorance characterize the parenting received by the heroines additionally the radical novelists responding to representations of biological families as inherently restrictive for unmarried women develop the notion of marriage to a certain type of man as a social duty marriage between two properly sensible people who have both cultivated their reason and understanding and who can live together as equals sharing domestic responsibilities is shown to be an ideal with the power to create social change positioning their depictions of marriage in opposition to earlier feminist depictions of female utopian societies the female radical novelists of the 1790s strive to depict relationships between men and women that are characterized by cooperation individual autonomy and equality what is most important about these depictions is their ultimate failure most of the female radical novelists find such marriages nearly impossible to conceptualize marriage for many of the female radical novelists was an institution they perceived as inextricably related to male concerns about property and inescapably patriarchal under the marriage laws of late eighteenth century british society unions between two worthy individuals outside the boundaries of marriage are shown in the female radical novels to be

equally problematic sex inevitably is the basis for such unions yet sex leaves women vulnerable to exploitation by men rather than the triumph therefore of what comes to be in these novels the male associated values of property and power through marriage the female radical novels end by suggesting an alternative community one that will shelter those members of society who are most frequently exploited in male attempts to accumulate this property and power women servants and children

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
