new york 1979 it is thanksgiving and evelina has her close family and beloved friends gathered around her heart weighted with gratitude for what she has and regret for what she has given up she has lived in america for over thirty years but she is still italian in her soul northern italy 1934 evelina leads a sheltered life with her parents and siblings in a villa of fading grandeur when her elder sister benedetta marries a banker to suit her father's wishes rather than her own evelina swears that she will never marry out of duty she knows nothing of romantic love but when she meets ezra son of the local dressmaker her heart recognises it like an old friend evelina wants these carefree days to last forever she wants to bask in sunshine beauty and love and pay no heed to the grey clouds gathering on the horizon but nothing lasts forever the shadows of war are darkening over europe and precious lives are under threat

first published in 1910 this study in social evolution from the 13th to the 16th century functioned as a successor to jacob burckhardt's the civilisation of the renaissance in italy 1860 the author developed burckhardt's idea of studying continuous trends over time whilst challenging his idea that early modern women enjoyed extraordinary freedom in comparison to their medieval predecessors boulding contrasts the idealization of women with real women at home and in life portraying women as expanding from protective bondage due to economic progress alongside what contemporary scholars saw as the degeneration of the catholic faith during and following the counter reformation he explores various roles of renaissance women including maidens married women housewives motherhood widowhood styles of dress nuns saints courtesans and academics in doing so boulding hoped to demonstrate how very substantial yet how wholly partial the emergence of women was during this late medieval and early modern period and that this coincided with the complete amelioration of humanity and an increase in kindliness and sense of duty among both men and women

this study examines the role of southern italian women who remained behind when their husbands emigrated in the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries by piecing together limited archival source material the author argues that married women were not voiceless or powerless when their husbands were abroad but they took on roles beyond their limited legal position they petitioned local officials requested passports received

remittances and handled the family finances all in the absence of their husbands the legal head of the family the study also emphasizes the connection forged between women and the new italian state at a time when women did not have political rights centering on basilicata a forgotten region of the italian south and one that has not been a major focus of scholarly investigation this study challenges stereotypes that the italian south was backwards uncivilized and lagging behind northern italy the author argues that large scale emigration greatly impacted the married women left behind in the villages of basilicata changing their social political and economic role

an ancient way of life living with nature and the seasons moving from high mountain to plain the cleanest air and water the purest food and wine a little girl tells the story of her last year at home high up in the apennines of italy the love of her family and neighbours the conviviality and shared purpose of her tight knit community the beloved grandmother she will leave behind as her parents head for the factory floors and restaurant kitchens of 1950 s edinburgh an immigrant s tale but also a record of a simpler life at one time negated and cast aside and now more than ever sought out and admired the wee italian girl is a document for many scottish italians who apart from picturesque villages and majestic mountains wish to really know from whom and where they came

post unification italy saw an unprecedented rise of the middle classes an expansion in the production of print culture and increased access to education and professions for women particularly in urban areas although there was still widespread illiteracy especially among women in both rural and urban areas there emerged a generation of women writers whose domestic fiction and journalism addressed a growing female readership this study looks at the work of three of the most significant women writers of the period la marchesa colombi neera and matilde serao these writers whose works had been largely forgotten for much of the last century only to be rediscovered by the italian feminist movement of the 1970s were widely read and received considerable critical acclaim in their day in their realist fiction and journalism these professional women writers documented and brought to light the ways in which women participated in everyday life in the newly independent italy and how their experiences differed profoundly from those of men katharine mitchell shows how these three authors while hardly radical emancipationists offered late nineteenth century readers an implicit feminist intervention and a legitimate means of approaching and engaging with the burning social and political issues of the day regarding the woman

question women's access to education and the professions legal rights and suffrage through close examinations of these authors and a selection of their works and with reference to their broader artistic socio historical and geo political contexts mitchell not only draws attention to their authentic representations of contemporary social and historical realities but also considers their important role as a cultural medium and catalyst for social change

this book explores how women's relationship with food has been represented in italian literature cinema scientific writings and other forms of cultural expression from the 19th century to the present italian women have often been portrayed cooking and serving meals to others while denying themselves the pleasure of the table the collection presents a comprehensive understanding of the symbolic meanings associated with food and of the way these intersect with italian women's socio cultural history and the feminist movement from case studies on sophia loren and elena ferrante to analyses of cookbooks by italian chefs each chapter examines the unique contribution italian culture has made to perceiving and portraying women in a specific relation to food addressing issues of gender identity and politics of the body

this book analyzes the spread of american female consumer culture to italy and its influence on italian women in the postwar and cold war periods eras marked by the political economic social and cultural battle between the united states and soviet union focusing on various aspects of this culture beauty and hygiene products refrigerators and department stores as well as shopping and magazine models the book examines the reasons for and the methods of american female consumer culture's arrival in italy the democratic consumer capitalist messages its products sought to sell to italian women and how italian women themselves reacted to this new cultural presence in their everyday lives did italian women become the american mrs consumer as such the book illustrates how the modern consuming american woman became a significant figure not only in italy's postwar recovery and transformation but also in the international and domestic cultural and social contests for the hearts and minds of italian women

women desire and power in italian cinema offers for the first time in italian cinema criticism a contextual study of the representation of women in twentieth century italian films marga cottino jones argues that the ways women are depicted on screen reflects a subconscious

sexual conservatism typical of an Italian society rooted within a patriarchal ideology the book then follows the slow but constant process of social awareness in the Italian society through women in film especially after the 1950s comprehensive in scope this book analyzes the films of internationally known male and female directors such as Antonioni Fellini Rossellini Visconti Bertolucci Benigni Cavani Wertmüller Comencini and Archibugi special consideration is given to the actresses and actors that have become the icons of Italian femininity and masculinity such as Sofia Loren Gina Lollobrigida Silvana Mangano Gian Carlo Giannini Marcello Mastroianni and Alberto Sordi

this volume brings together specialists from a variety of disciplines to develop a deeper understanding of the social political and cultural history of women in Italy in the years 1946-1960 despite being a time when women and the family were at the center of national debates and when society changed considerably the fifteen years following the second world war have tended to be overlooked or subsumed into discussions of other periods by focusing on the experience of women and by broadening the frame of reference to include subjects and sources often ignored or only alluded to by traditional analyses the essays in this volume break new ground and provide a corrective to previous interpretive models

this book explores an important moment in Italian women's theatre and cultural history plays written for all women casts between 1946 and the mid 1960s authored for the most part by women and performed exclusively by women because they featured only female

roles they concentrated on aspects of specifically women's experience be it their spirituality their future lives as wives and mothers their present lives as workers or students or their relationships with friends sisters and mothers most often performed in a catholic environment they were meant to both entertain and educate reflecting the specific issues that both performers and spectators had to confront in the years between the end of the war and the beginning of the economic miracle drawing on material never before researched educational theatre for women in post world war ii italy a stage of their own recovers the life and works of forgotten women playwrights while also discussing the role models that educational theatre offered to the young italian women coming of age in the post war years

the essays included in this collection examine issues such as identity and ideology which are at play in the female autobiography practice along with the problematicity that these trigger in terms of self representation and traditional formal boundaries the women writers analyzed here through mainly historical literary feminist and psychoanalytic lenses cover a long period in the history of italy spanning from the fascist era to our time in an attempt to organize and connect these texts which are chronologically far apart we have divided our contributions into two main parts the first shapes of ideology includes authors interacting primarily with political ideology in a way that eventually entails the challenge of the official technologies of gender de lauretis 1987 and implicitly a reflection on the gendered identity in the second part reconsidering ideology negotiating autobiography while the political ideology is not completely excluded it becomes however something more internalized and relevant to the writers quest for identity such process bears consequences with respect to the canon of autobiography as authors experiment with new forms of autobiographical narratives and readers become more and more an integral component of this personal

italian women writers 1800 2000 boundaries borders and transgression investigates narrative autobiography and poetry by italian women writers from the nineteenth century to today focusing on topics of spatial and cultural boundaries border identities and expressions of excluded identities this book discusses works by known and less known writers as well as by some new writers sibilla aleramo la marchesa colombi giuliana morandini elsa morante neera matilde serao ribka sibhatu patrizia valduga annie vivanti laila waida among others writers who in their works have manifested transgression to confinement and entrapment either social cultural or professional or who have given significance to national and transnational borders or have employed particular narrative strategies to give voice to what often exceeds expression through its contributions the volume demonstrates how italian women writers have negotiated material as well as social and cultural boundaries and how their literary imagination has created dimensions of boundary crossing

focusing on key members of the pisan circle byron the shelleys and leigh hunt maria schoina explores configurations of identity and the acculturating practices of british expatriates in post napoleonic italy the problems involved in british romanticism s relations to its european others are her point of departure as she argues that the emergence and mission of what mary shelley termed the anglo italian is inextricably linked to the social political economic and cultural conditions of the age the forging of the british identity in the midst of an expanding empire the rise of the english middle class and the establishment of a competitive print culture and the envisioning by a group of male and female romantic liberal intellectuals of social and political reform schoina s emphasis on the political implications of the british romantics hyphenated self representation results in fresh readings of the pisan circle s italianate writings that move them away from interpretations focused on a purely aesthetic or poetic attachment to italy to uncover their complex ideological underpinnings

over the course of the 20th century the rapid transformation of italy from an impoverished

predominantly agricultural nation to one of the strongest economies in the world forged a fascinating and contradictory society where gender relations were a particular mix of modernity and tradition in this accessible and innovative study perry willson provides a nuanced and insightful analysis of the impact of social political economic and cultural developments on italian women s lives she also explores how women were affected by and how they themselves helped shape key historical events such as the rise of fascism the 2 world wars the economic miracle of the post war years and the cultural and political upheavals of the 1970s women in twentieth century italy is the first book length overview of italian women s experience during this period of intense and dramatic change drawing on the latest historiography in the field and written in a lively and engaging manner it is essential reading for anyone with an interest in italy s recent past

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
