this edited collection introduces readers to the main concepts that comprise the spectrum of diversity and multicultural education in canada with a particular focus on social justice and on what human flourishing might mean in these contexts diversity and equity in canadian schools blends theory and practice with each section containing one theoretical and one practical chapter devoted to each area of diversity including socio economic status gender and sexual orientation language religion geography disability ethnicity and race and indigenous education with a continuous focus on intersectionality the first chapter in each section is conceptual providing thoughtful narrative of the historical and current concerns of the given area of diversity the second chapter then provides practical considerations for educators in the k 12 classroom building teacher capacity both to work against the structures policies curriculum and pedagogies that limit marginalized students flourishing and to build the capabilities for flourishing in all students readers are provided with practical guidelines to help them approach each chapter with openness humility and critical engagement diversity and equity in canadian schools is well suited for canadian university courses in education that focus on critical multicultural education and equity diversity and inclusion in the classroom

in canada today there is a clear move toward a more outcomes based education system this report examines the state of high school student assessment and reviews standards and accountability strategies it reports on the policies programs and initiatives in all provincial ministries or departments of education and a sample of school boards across the country data were derived from a telephone survey of departmental ministerial representatives from all 10 provinces and the 2 territories and from a questionnaire that was mailed to 279 school boards a total of 140 boards responded a 50 percent response rate data show that both boards and ministries are putting more emphasis on the development of comprehensive policies to cover all aspects of student evaluation there is some movement away from relying on paper and pencil testing as the sole means of evaluation the use of more authentic performance based approaches and a greater variety of assessment techniques are being promoted some of the best practices in high school evaluation involve use of a broad range of assessment methods introduction of or improvements to provincial examinations greater use of summative and formative evaluations greater emphasis on modifying evaluation for special needs students use of performance based assessment and more reporting to parents and the public thirteen tables are included appendices contain copies of the two questionnaires and selected school board material contains 19 references Imi

this thorough study will be of assistance to those seeking to understand the role of education in contemporary canada education policy and practice regarding language and culture are highlighted as is the crucially important question of cultural transmission

critical perspectives on white supremacy and racism in canadian education shows how k 12 schooling continues to produce and maintain white supremacist and colonial logics and questions the alternate future of schooling in canada it argues that white supremacy and race in schooling are present in colonial centered approaches to teacher education formal and informal exclusion through curriculum development and persistent failed commitments to racial justice and decolonization these themes guide the organization of this collection which is further underpinned by theoretical perspectives including critical race theory anti blackness theory abolition and anticolonial theory contributions are drawn from classroom teachers community educators and pre service teacher educators and are powerfully informed by first hand accounts as well as stories of teachers and teacher candidates combining theory with practice this edited volume will be important reading for advanced undergraduate and postgraduate students in social justice education multicultural education and indigenous studies it will also be beneficial reading for antiracist and indigenous education researchers as well as policymakers and practitioners within critical education

the two volumes comprising indian education in canada present the first full length discussion of this important subject since the adoption in 1972 of a new federal policy moving toward indian control of indian education volume 1 analyzes the education of indian children by whites since the arrival of the first europeans in canada volume 2 is concerned with the wide ranging changes that have taken place since 1972
