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in 1851 olive oatman was a thirteen year old pioneer traveling west toward zion with her mormon family within a decade she was a white indian with a chin tattoo caught between cultures the blue tattoo tells the harrowing story of this forgotten heroine

of frontier america orphaned when her family was brutally killed by yavapai indians oatman lived as a slave to her captors for a year before being traded to the mohave who tattooed her face and raised her as their own she was fully assimilated and perfectly happy when at nineteen she was ransomed back to white society she became an instant celebrity but the price of fame was high and the pain of her ruptured childhood lasted a lifetime based on historical records including letters and diaries of oatman s friends and relatives the blue tattoo is the first book to examine her life from her childhood in illinois including the massacre her captivity and her return to white society to her later years as a wealthy banker s wife in texas oatman s story has since become legend inspiring artworks fiction film radio plays and even an episode of death valley days starring ronald reagan its themes from the perils of religious utopianism to the permeable border between civilization and savagery are deeply rooted in the american psyche oatman s blue tattoo was a cultural symbol that evoked both the imprint of her mohave past and the lingering scars of westward expansion it also served as a reminder of her deepest secret fully explored here for the first time she never wanted to go home

description this book provides a quick glimpse about the life of olive oatman

anthropologist and archaeologist lillian m fisher gives an account of the capture of two young pioneer girls by apaches following the massacre of the girls parents and the girls experiences in captivity only olive ultimately survived and returned

andrea tinnemeyer s book examines the nineteenth century captivity narrative as a dynamic complex genre that provided an ample medium for cultural critique a revision of race relations and a means of elucidating the u s mexican war s complex and often contradictory significance in the national imagination the captivity narrative as tinnemeyer shows addressed questions arising from the incorporation of residents in the newly annexed territory this genre transformed its heroine from the quintessential white virgin into the mexican maiden in order to quell anxieties over miscegenation condone acts furthering manifest destiny or otherwise romanticize the land grabbing nature of the war and of the opportunists who traveled to the southwest after 1848 some of these narratives condone and even welcome interracial marriages between mexican women and anglo american men by understanding marriage for love as an expression of free will or as a declaration of independence texts containing interracial marriages or romanticizing the u s mexican war could politicize the nuptials and present the anglo american husband as a hero and rescuer this romanticizing of annexation and cross border marriages tended to feminize mexico making the country appear captive and in need of american rescue and influencing the understanding of foreign and domestic by relocating geographic and racial boundaries in addition to examining more conventional notions of captivity tinnemeyer s book uses war song lyrics and legal cases to argue that captivity is a multivalenced term encompassing desire identity formation

and variable definitions of citizenship

a comparative history of the relocation and removal of indigenous societies in the greater american southwest during the mid nineteenth century lost worlds of 1863 relocation and removal of american indians in the central rockies and the greater southwest offers a unique comparative narrative approach to the diaspora experiences of the apaches o odham and yaqui in arizona and sonora the navajo and yavapai in arizona the shoshone of utah the utes of colorado the northern paiutes of nevada and california and other indigenous communities in the region focusing on the events of the year 1863 w dirk raat provides an in depth examination of the mid nineteenth century genocide and devastation of the american indian addressing the loss of both the identity and the sacred landscape of indigenous peoples the author compares various kinds of relocation between different indigenous groups ranging from the removal and assimilation policies of the united states government regarding the navajo and paiute people to the outright massacre and extermination of the bear river shoshone the book is organized around detailed individual case studies that include extensive histories of the pre contact spanish and mexican worlds that created the context for the pivotal events of 1863 this important volume narrates the history of indian communities such as the yavapai apache o odham and navajo both before and after 1863 addresses how the american indian has been able to survive genocide and in some cases thrive in the present day discusses topics including indian slavery and lincoln s emancipation proclamation the yaqui deportation apache prisoners of war and great basin tribal politics explores indian ceremonial rites and belief systems to illustrate the relationship between sacred landscapes and personal identity features sub chapters on topics such as the hopi navajo land controversy and native american boarding schools includes numerous maps and illustrations contextualizing the content for readers lost worlds of 1863 relocation and removal of american indians in the central rockies and the greater southwest is essential reading for academics students and general readers with interest in western history native american history and the history of indian white relations in the united states and mexico

history books record scant contributions women made in settling and developing the new territory of arizona yet women were an integral part of civilizing the rough rowdy often dangerous land for more than ten years jan cleere has written about the women who influenced the growth and development of arizona in her column western women that appears monthly in the arizona daily star newspaper the famous infamous and those not so well known are featured each with a compelling story of surviving and thriving under less than ideal circumstances warriors basket weavers ranchers artists innkeepers schoolteachers politicians and entrepreneurs from a remarkable variety of backgrounds and cultures influenced the growth of arizona read about larcena pennington who had to crawl down a mountain to escape her indian captors hopi artist nampeyo continued to make exquisite

pots even after she started losing her eyesight carmen vasquez built a theater and brought in shows from as far away as spain elizabeth hudson smith ran a successful hotel until the color of her skin turned a town against her and sarah gorby allowed injured animals to live in her home until they could return to their desert habitats the 100 western women featured between these pages are just a handful of those who came before and after them as the territory emerged and flourished into an amazing and diverse state unlike any other in the nation

merciless killing in the nineteenth century american west as this unusual book shows was not as simple as depicted in dime novels and movie westerns the scholars interviewed here experts on violence in the west embrace a wide range of approaches and perspectives and challenge both traditional views of western expansion and politically correct ideologies the battle of the little big horn the sand creek massacre the battle of the washita and the mountain meadows massacre are iconic events that have been repeatedly described and analyzed but the interviews included in this volume offer new points of view other events discussed here are little known today such as the camp grant massacre in which anglo americans mexican americans and tohono o odham indians killed more than a hundred pinal and aravaipa apache men women and children in addition to specific events the interviews cover broader themes such as violence in early california hostilities between the frontier army and the sioux including the santee sioux revolt and wounded knee and violence between european americans and great basin tribes such as the bear river massacre the scholars interviewed include academic historians public historians an anthropologist and a journalist the interview format provides insights into the methodology and tools of historical research and allows questions and speculations often absent from conventional written accounts the scholars share their latest thoughts on long standing controversies address the political uses often made of history and discuss the need to incorporate multiple viewpoints scholars and students of history and historiography will be fascinated by the nuts and bolts information about the practice of history revealed in these interviews in addition readers with specific interests in the events discussed will gain much new information and many fresh insights
