many people are intrigued by the abstract work of artists like mondrian and jackson pollock yet find it difficult to explain why in this timely and original book briony fer introduces abstract painting and sculpture of the twentieth century and explores new ways to think about abstract art and the problems of interpretation it raises fer speculates on the kind of language required to describe the often tantalizing effects of key abstract works and on ways to discuss critical issues when a work of art is without subject matter drawing particularly on psychoanalytic theory and the writings of georges bataille she examines a wide range of models of abstraction ranging from the early european emphasis on the transcendental possibilities of pure form to later modernist frameworks developed in the united states each of the ten chapters in the book addresses a particular problem associated with abstract art by focusing closely on specific works produced by such artists as malevich mondrian kandinsky arp miró pollock eva hesse and donald judd fer investigates the involvement of women artists such as lyubov popova and the problems of sexual difference in the development of abstract art countering the idealizing rhetoric of modernist criticism on abstract art uncovers a latent corporeal and darker side to abstraction and deepens today s discussion of a variety of critical concerns in contemporary art

traditional art is based on conventions of resemblance between the work and that which it is a representation of abstract art in contrast either adopts alternative modes of visual representation or reconfigures mimetic convention this book explores the relation of abstract art to nature taking nature in the broadest sense the world of recognisable objects creatures organisms processes and states of affairs abstract art takes many different forms but there are shared key structural features centered on two basic relations to nature the first abstracts from nature to give selected aspects of it a new and extremely unfamiliar appearance the second affirms a natural creativity that issues in new autonomous forms that are not constrained by mimetic conventions such creativity is often attributed to the power of the unconscious the book covers three categories classical modernism mondrian malevich kandinsky arp early american abstraction post war abstraction pollock still newman smithson noguchi arte povera michaux postmodern developments and the broader historical and philosophical scope

abstract paintings are discussed here both from the point of view of their creators and from the point of view of the spectator then the kind of question repeatedly asked about abstraction is asked and answered by what standards can an abstract painting be judged does abstraction set out to disregard the public s expectations and wishes if so is it unique in this does the viewer contribute more to an appreciation of an abstract painting than to a more traditional work does any abstract painting have a message if so how does it express it is it necessary to know anything about the artist himself in order to fully appreciate his work does an abstract painting require more or less skill in its execution than a traditional work is there anything more to abstraction than novelty back cover

traces the use of geometric signs by the nabis and other french artists and relates this to the development of abstraction the author describes some of the sources of ideas about the symbolism of geometric signs in particular the writings of helena p blavatsky and traces the impact of these on the nabis possibly through the stimulus of gauguin whose paintings from his brittany period encouraged a mystical conception of art in which sacred geometry figured as one component he goes on to discuss in detail the paintings of paul serusier paul ranson maurice denis charles filiger jean delville frantisek kupka and mondrian

this series introduces the major movements in late nineteenth and twentieth century art each book is illustrated with works from tate and other major collections around the world in a new approach to the subject the author rejects the view that the story of abstraction can be traced as a succession if stylistic trends each set within its particular art historical context he offers instead readings of specific paintings and sculptures by artists such as kasimir malevich naum gabo piet mondrian and jackson pollock treating them as exemplary of particular tendancies within the overlapping histories of abstraction

recent decades have seen a renewed interest in the phenomenon of abstract art particularly regarding its ability to speak to the political social and cultural conditions of our times this collection of essays which looks at historical examples of artistic practice from the early pioneers of abstraction to late modernism

ad reinhardt is probably best known for his black paintings which aroused as much controversy as admiration in the american art world when they were first exhibited in the 1950s although his ideas about art and life were often at odds with those of his contemporaries they prefigured the ascendance of minimalism reinhardt s interest in the orient and in religion his strong convictions about the value of abstraction and his disgust with the commercialism of the art world are as fresh and valid today as they were when he first expressed them

this book uncovers how we make meaning of abstraction both historically and in present times and examines abstract images as a visual language the contributors demonstrate that abstraction is not primarily an artistic phenomenon but rather arises from human beings desire to imagine understand and communicate complex ineffable concepts in fields ranging from fine art and philosophy to technologies of data visualization from cartography and medicine to astronomy the book will be of interest to scholars working in image studies visual studies art history philosophy and aesthetics

this is the most thorough and detailed monograph on the artwork of raymond jonson he is one of many artists of the first half of the twentieth century who demonstrate the richness and diversity of an under appreciated period in the history of american art visualizing the spiritual was one of the fundamental goals of early abstract painting in the years before and during world war i artists turned to alternative spirituality the occult and mysticism believing that the pure use of line shape color light and texture could convey spiritual insight jonson was steadfastly dedicated to this goal for most of his career and he always believed that modernist and abstract styles were the most effective and compelling means of

achieving it

this dissertation explores the historical narrative and aesthetic characteristics of chinese abstract art throughout the twentieth century its primary goal is to establish a chronological evolution of chinese abstraction it argues that the genesis of chinese abstraction can be traced back to the early twentieth century although abstract painting was not created in this period the earliest linguistic translations concerning abstract art and the emergence of modernist paintings popular science optical devices new photographic techniques and urban visual culture collectively shaped a new aesthetics of simplicity and rationality expressed in geometric abstract forms of fine art photography fashion graphic interior industrial and product design the case study of the creation of chinese abstract art is wu dayu s private experiments in the maoist period wu s manuscripts correspondences self made canvas small size works and other materials attested to his exploration of abstract painting revealing an alternative art beneath the mainstream socialist realism wu s art played an essential role in the history of chinese abstraction as it links abstract art s incubation in the republican period and its boom in the post mao period following wu s experiments is the flourishment of abstract art in the reform and opening up period when china established diplomatic ties with western countries however this boom did not come without a price there was a twisting path towards understanding and accepting abstract painting reformist artists and scholars reconstructed artistic and cultural meanings of abstract painting to respond to public criticism on the ideological implication of abstract art relevant to the historical narrative is the evolution in the stylistic features of chinese abstraction this dissertation investigates works by artists of different generations including their abstract styles techniques media and the natural and cultural resources upon which they enrich their abstract vocabularies the elderly artists like wu dayu wu guanzhong and yu youhan maintained the traditional method of easel painting popular during the time adopting an approach of reduction and simplification to create abstract paintings that stress the independence of painterly elements such as dots lines circles colors and brushstrokes the younger generations furthered the movement by introducing non traditional art media and forms in so doing they have redefined abstract painting as more than finite and static objects created for human viewing but as autonomous and dynamic forces that connect the multiple entities of nature artist and viewer waves of social and political changes in twentieth century china made it particularly challenging to develop abstract art in chinese society the ultimate legitimacy of abstract art resulted from the collective efforts of artists of different generations their firm belief in art and life their continuous experiments and their brave attempts to engage art in society while this dissertation ends with twentieth century chinese abstraction it also recognizes a starting point of twenty first century chinese abstraction where science and technologies become a new inspiration for artistic creation and only time will tell how the new trend in chinese abstraction develops

this book examines how we perceive and understand abstract art in contrast to artworks that represent reality philosophical psychological and neuroscience research including the work of philosopher paul crowther are considered and out of these approaches a complex model is developed to account for this experience the understanding embodied in this model is rooted in facet theory mapping sentences and partially ordered analyses which together provide a comprehensive understanding of the perceptual experience of abstract art

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
