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the transitional politics of eurasian space is marked by a constant struggle among three sets of ideas and institutions the 1 is the remarkable resilience of soviet ideas and institutions 2 an attempt by the regimes of these states to reinvent the historical and cultural traditions of presoviet periods and third is an attempt by a section of the powerful elite to superimpose western liberal ideas and institutions there is a strange intertwining of these ideas and institutions this book examines the extent to which the postsoviet politics has departed from the soviet one what are the new ideational structures emerging in these states and how far have they crystallised into institutions what are the external influences which are shaping the institutions in the eurasian space and finally what are the various dynamics of geopolitics in this region experts from various countries will delve

into the shifting dynamics of eurasian politics

the end of the cold war dramatically and unexpectedly transformed international politics toward the end of the 20th century at the heart of this change was the struggle over new and old ideas

through the last couple of decades scholars on both sides of the atlantic have increasingly emphasized the importance of political ideas in understanding processes of change and stability in politics and public policy yet surprisingly relatively little has been done to more clearly and stringently conceptualize the relationship between political power and the role of ideas in public policy and political development this volume addresses this major lacuna in the policy and political studies literature by bringing some of best scholars in the field who each write about the relationship between ideas and power in politics and public policy the contributions frame the concept of ideational power and explore ways in which ideas shape power relations across a number of distinct countries and policy areas the topics covered include austerity coalition building monetary policy social policy tax policy and macroeconomic indicators the volume features a short introduction written by the co editors and a final recapitulative essay prepared by mark blyth one of the most cited scholars in the field this book was previously published as a special issue of the journal of european public policy

conflicts over waste disposal facility siting is a pressing issue not only in developed countries but also in fast growing countries that face drastic waste increase and rapid urbanisation how to address distributive justice has been one of the biggest concerns this book examines what determines the influence of distributive justice in siting policy in the 23 wards of tokyo one idea of distributive justice known as in ward waste disposal iwwd emerged amid the ongoing garbage crisis in the early 1970s iwwd was adopted as a significant principle but its influence waxed and waned over time until the idea was finally abandoned in 2003 to unravel causes and mechanisms behind the changing influence of iwwd this book adopts a framework that considers not only ideational causes but also the power struggles between rationally calculating actors as well as the influence of external events and environments by combining an in depth case study with an integrative theoretical framework this book tells a thought provoking story of the changing influence of iwwd in a deep comprehensive and consistent way this book provides significant insights and lessons for both academics and practitioners

chicago is celebrated for its rich diversity but even more than most us cities it is also plagued by segregation and extreme inequality more than ever chicago is a dual city a condition taken for granted by many residents in this book joel rast reveals that today s tacit acceptance of rising urban inequality is a marked departure from the past for much of the twentieth century a key goal for civic leaders was the total elimination of slums and

blight yet over time as anti slum efforts faltered leaders shifted the focus of their initiatives away from low income areas and toward the upgrading of neighborhoods with greater economic promise as misguided as postwar public housing and urban renewal programs were they were born of a long standing reformist impulse aimed at improving living conditions for people of all classes and colors across the city something that can't be said to be a true priority for many policymakers today the origins of the dual city illuminates how we normalized and became resigned to living amid stark racial and economic divides

since the early 1990s the federal role in education exemplified by the controversial no child left behind act nclb has expanded dramatically yet states and localities have retained a central role in education policy leading to a growing struggle for control over the direction of the nation's schools in an education in politics jesse h rhodes explains the uneven development of federal involvement in education while supporters of expanded federal involvement enjoyed some success in bringing new ideas to the federal policy agenda rhodes argues they also encountered stiff resistance from proponents of local control built atop existing decentralized policies new federal reforms raised difficult questions about which level of government bore ultimate responsibility for improving schools rhodes's argument focuses on the role played by civil rights activists business leaders and education experts in promoting the reforms that would be enacted with federal policies such as nclb it also underscores the constraints on federal involvement imposed by existing education policies hostile interest groups and above all the nation's federal system indeed the federal system which left specific policy formation and implementation to the states and localities repeatedly frustrated efforts to effect changes national reforms lost their force as policies passed through iterations at the state county and municipal levels ironically state and local resistance only encouraged civil rights activists business leaders and their political allies to advocate even more stringent reforms that imposed heavier burdens on state and local governments through it all the nation's education system made only incremental steps toward the goal of providing a quality education for every child

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
