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the days of creation examines the history of christian interpretation of the seven day framework of genesis 1 1 2 3 in the hebrew bible old testament from the post apostolic era to the debates surrounding essays and reviews 1860 included in the survey are patristic medieval renaissance reformation eighteenth century enlightenment and finally early to mid nineteenth century interpretations of the days of creation the author shows that readings of genesis 1 1 2 3 in the modern era have much deeper roots than is sometimes realized the day age scheme has roots in augustine s figurative creation days the world week historical scheme renaissance platonism and newtonian science while the literal alternative of the gap theory combines ancient literal interpretation with chaos concepts derived from greco roman myths and interpreted through a geological lens early treatments of this text are poorly understood because of their very different philosophical and theological contexts hasty appropriation of ancient precedents as support for modern interpretations often overlooks or oversimplifies this difference changing ideas and exploration in the early modern era undermined the dominance of this text so that by the time of goodwin s essay in essays and reviews genesis 1 1 2 3 was already well on the way to its present intellectual marginalization this study enables an insight into the mighty career of a biblical text of seminal importance and fills a significant niche in reception historical research

this volume discusses the narrative of the creation of heaven earth and light in the first chapter of genesis and focuses extensively on its later interpretations in different cultural and religious contexts after an introductory paper on the text of genesis itself the authors deal with receptions of this theme in the prophet jeremiah early judaism and the dead sea scrolls they comment on creation accounts in the ancient near east ancient greece and ancient philosophy reconstructing the earliest known receptions of genesis 1 in ancient philosophers like numenius and galen they trace its influence in the johannine petrine and pauline traditions of early christianity and follow it right through the middle ages up till the present day discussion of design in nature

christian apologist ben smith believes that the creation account in genesis 1 can be read literally and historically as a real week of seven normal days without contradicting modern astronomy and geology regarding the age of the universe and earth many christians are divided over how to reconcile genesis with modern science and this book evaluates all of the major options ultimately concluding that the bible allows for an old universe and earth in a way that is also scientifically accurate a former young earth creationist smith now believes that the age of creation is not specified in the bible and therefore scientists are free to answer the question he believes that christians should not hide from the controversy over the age of the

earth but should take a fresh look at the text and be impressed with its accuracy

original sin and the evolution of sexual difference re examines christian thinking about original sin and sexual difference in conversation with recent developments in evolutionary biology and feminist philosophy and theology

this title was first published in 2002 the premise of the text is that there is a continuing need for biblical hermeneutic proposals and frameworks which emerge from the fields of both feminism and christian theology feminism the author asserts demands not only the plotting of new routes but the restructuring of entire landscapes as such this project since it seeks to develop a feminist theological frame for meaning impinges on and is impacted by innumerable inter relating questions in consequence the scope of the book is necessarily both broad and interdisciplinary the author j annine jobling uses particular texts and has articulated her own positions in response in this way the embodied practice of thinking in relation is mirrored in the texts produced this has determined the macro structure of the thesis which is based on an analysis of two feminist biblical scholars elisabeth schussler fionenza and phyllis trible from this analysis jobling identifies two primary principles for interpretation remembrance and destabilization this is a strategy which allows both materialist and post structuralist perspectives to be set into play each of which has vital contributions to make to feminist enterprises the bible is understood

as matrix as a set of discourses which are permeable to and intersect with other cultural discourses the task of feminist interpretation is then to reconstitute the heterogenous biblical matrix in feminist horizons a fundamental tenet of the book is that hermeneutics inhabits particular metaphysical constructs therefore the argument extends from an interpretation of the bible to an epistemological framework in which an eschatological hereneutic is recommended to a metaphysical framework which takes eschatology as its structuring principle the author argues that it is eschatology which can provide the resources for an ontological model radically disruptive of a metaphysics of presence and in which it is possible to discern the traces of god from this outermost limit of the author s hermeneutic investigations the text returns to the centre the feminist discursive community and develops a construct that the ekklesia as a feminist deliberative space set oppositionally to structures worldviews and idealogies operates on patriarchal logics the relationship of this imagined community is compared to the christian church and scripture ethics and gendered identity within a logic of equity
