as a young priest luigi giussani was troubled by catholicism s inability to effectively deal with secularism or laicism in 1954 he began to develop a vision of faith rooted in experience his ideas resonated with students and led to the birth of the gioventù studentesca student youth movement known today as communion and liberation the movement is flourishing in italy and around the world including canada the united states brazil uganda and britain the journey to truth is an experience is the first english translation of il cammino al vero è un esperienza giussani s early works on the christian experience written from 1959 64 it begins with a guide on how to live the christian life within the student youth community followed by a call to base one s relationship with christ on the example set by the apostles and other figures in the new testament giussani concludes by outlining the movement s mission and the possibility for community charity and communion in the christian life

monsignor luigi giussani 1922 2005 was the founder of the catholic lay movement communion and liberation in italy which has hundreds of thousands of adherents around the globe in the life of luigi giussani alberto savorana who spent an important part of his life working and studying with giussani draws on many unpublished documents to recount who the priest was and how he lived giussani s life story is particularly significant because it shares many of the same challenges risks and paths toward enlightenment that are described in his numerous and influential publications savorana demonstrates that the circumstances giussani experienced and the people he encountered played a crucial role in defining his vocation illuminating details are shared about giussani s parents professors and friends in the seminary the things he read his priesthood his experience

teaching misunderstandings and moments of recognition and illness luigi giussani considered christianity to be a fact a real event in human life which takes the form of an encounter inviting anyone and everyone to verify its relevance to life s needs this is what happened for so many people all over the world who recognized in this priest and leader with his rough and captivating voice not only a teacher to learn from but above all a man to compare oneself with a companion for the journey who could be trusted to answer the question how can we live in addition to providing the first chronological reconstruction of the life of the founder of communion and liberation the life of luigi giussani provides a detailed account of his legacy and what his life s work meant to individual people and the church

father luigi giussani engaged tirelessly in educational initiatives throughout the course of his life much of his thought was communicated through the richness and rhythm of oral discourse preserved as audio and video recordings in the archive of the fraternity of communion and liberation in milan this volume presents the last three spiritual exercises of the fraternity of communion and liberation drawing from the transcripts of these recordings in these exercises giussani investigates the rise of ethics and the decline of ontology that have accompanied modernity and the spread of rationalism bearing up against old age and illness he resisted the urge to withdraw instead finding new avenues of communication and the technological means to reach all corners of the movement to give one s life for the work of another explores the nature of god the powerful human experience of self awareness and the fundamental components of christianity in the unmistakable voice of a consummate teacher at a time when young people are abandoning the church and questioning the value of faith father giussani s method of judging and verifying christianity as an experience is a timeless intervention

the communion and liberation movement began in milan italy in the 1950s as an attempt to communicate the awareness that christ is the one true response to the deepest needs of people at every moment of history the person who encounters and welcomes the presence of christ undergoes a conversion that affects not only the individual but also the surrounding environment the movement spread rapidly throughout italy and is now present in some seventy countries around the world

catholic sexual responsibility norms and for religious freedom generally not only among lawmakers and judges but also in the court of public opinion which includes skeptical catholics the u s constitution protects catholic institutions autonomy their authority over faith and doctrine internal operations and the personnel involved in personifying and transmitting the faith other constitutional and statutory provisions also safeguard religious freedom if not always perfectly catholic institutions could take far better advantage of all of these existing protections if they communicated first how they differ from secular institutions how their missions emerge from their faith in jesus christ and their efforts both to make his presence felt in the world today and to display the inbreaking of the kingdom of god second they need to draw out the link between their teachings on sexual responsibility and love of god and neighbor drawing upon scripture tradition history theology and empirical evidence helen alvaré frames a more complete inspiring and appealing response to current laws attempts to impose a new sexual orthodoxy upon catholic institutions it clarifies the ecclesial nature of catholic schools hospitals and social services it summarizes the empirical evidence supporting the link between personnel decisions and mission and between catholic sexual responsibility norms and human flourishing it grounds catholic sexual responsibility teachings in the same love of god and neighbor that animate the existence operations and services of catholic institutions
